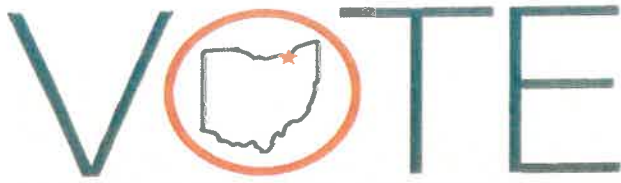

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Meeting began at 9:30 a.m. Hereinafter referred to as the CCBOE/Board.

Chairman Curtis noted that all Board Members were in attendance.

---

**Agenda Item 1: Approval of the minutes from the March 15, 2024, board meeting**

Chairman Curtis moved to approve the minutes from the March 15, 2024, board meeting. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**Agenda Item 2: Acknowledgment of Secretary of State Memorandum 2024-02: Organizational Meeting of Major Political Party County Central Committee**

Chairman Curtis moved to acknowledge the Secretary of State Memorandum 2024-02: Organizational Meeting of Major Political Party County Central Committee. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**Agenda Item 3: Authorization to pursue judicial declaration of the CCBOE's rights to dispose of certain records exceeding their retention period**

Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the agenda item had to do with any pending court proceeding. Assistant Prosecutor Musson stated it is not an existing litigation matter, but it is seeking the ability to initiate litigation on the Board's behalf. Board Member Davis Chappell clarified that the issue does not arise out of ongoing litigation. Mr. Musson said no. Director Perlatti stated there was a public records request for documents related to the August 2021, Special Congressional Primary Election, which involved 13 pallets of items. The CCBOE solicited bids from vendors to copy the materials because, in addition to the ballots, the requester wanted copies of all the scanner tapes. The CCBOE informed the original requester the three quotes the CCBOE solicited were around \$20,000 to copy the materials. The original requester communicated back and forth with the CCBOE, wanting to come to the CCBOE and scan the documents themselves. The CCBOE responded by explaining how the process would work, as the CCBOE is the custodian of these records. Director Perlatti said the CCBOE reached a point in time where

it advised the requester of a need to make a determination or the CCBOE was going to go ahead and move forward with destroying these documents, which were past the retention period. The CCBOE then received a public records request from a different person to inspect these records. The CCBOE communicated back and forth with this individual on setting terms. The CCBOE advised the individual that they could inspect the documents, but the time would need to be scheduled as the CCBOE needs staff to unpack, pack, keep everything orderly, and monitor the inspection. The person who requested the inspection said they could not have people at the CCBOE for many months. Board Member Davis Chappell stated there are two competing interests. There is public interest in the records, and the CCBOE must ensure compliance with the Sunshine Laws about allowing the public to access the records. Still, there is the competing requirement and obligation that the CCBOE complete the preservation of documents, and the CCBOE needs to destroy the documents because of space constraints. She stated it is better for a court to decide.

Chairman Curtis moved to authorize to pursue judicial declaration of the CCBOE's rights to dispose of certain records exceeding their retention period. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Agenda Item 4: Determination of the validity of provisional ballots and authorization to count provisional ballots from the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election**

Hasani Wheat, Registration Department Manager, presented the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election Provisional Report to the Board, as provided in the meeting materials. Mr. Wheat stated two voters were flagged to vote provisionally due to being registered at commercial post office boxes. Those two individuals did cast provisional ballots, which will not be counted. Director Perlatti stated the CCBOE sent out notices at the beginning of 2024 to individuals registered at a UPS store mailbox, which individuals can not be registered at. A post office box can be used as a mailing address but not as a residential address. The CCBOE also provided those individuals with a registration card to update their address information and return the card. The deadline provided in the notice to update their voter registration was February 20, 2024, the close of registration. He said one individual did update their voter registration. The individuals who did not update their address were placed in a "must vote provisional" status. Two individuals of the individuals voted provisionally on election day and wrote in a post office box as their residential address. The address listed is not valid; therefore, their provisionals have been listed as rejected. Director Perlatti said one of the individuals did contact the CCBOE Registration Department and discussed the matter. The individual now understands that a post office box is not a residential address and has updated her voter registration listing a residential address and listed the post office box as her mailing address. For the May 7, 2024, board meeting, Mr. Wheat will file residency challenge forms against all the other individuals to have residency hearings. The Board will then make a determination. Board Member Davis Chappell asked how the CCBOE can be more proactive in preventing individuals from registering at post office boxes. Mr. Wheat stated that typically, commercial addresses are flagged, and their voter registrations are not processed. Director Perlatti stated there will be additional training regarding individuals using a post office box as a residential address. He added that the Registration Department will conduct regular voter registration system reviews for individuals who list a post office box. Deputy Director Kaloger stated these addresses were discovered during the January reports review. He said that after the May 7, 2024, board meeting, the address would be blocked in the voter registration system by individuals attempting to register at that address.

Mr. Wheat stated that Norma King, whose residency was challenged and canceled twice in the voter registration database, had voted provisionally in the March 19, 2024 Primary Election. Ms. King listed 1735 Elsinor Ave, East Cleveland, as her residential address. She is currently listed in the provisional module as "not registered" and the provisional ballot will not be counted. Director Perlatti stated Norma

King is not registered at the 1725 Elsinor address, and the provisional ballot will be rejected. He said that, per the Secretary of State, the CCBOE needs to register her at the Elsinor address, which is the address on the provisional ballot. Mr. Wheat will file a residency challenge, and the Board will have a third hearing. Director Perlatti stated that Deputy Director Kaloger contacted the SOS Public Integrity Division and the Attorney General's office investigator and advised them of the ongoing voting pattern at that address. A third referral will likely be forthcoming. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the CCBOE records and the testimony at the Board hearing show that Ms. King does not reside at the 1735 Elsinore address. Director Perlatti said, correct. The provisional envelope is not only a ballot but also considered a registration card. When Ms. King votes provisionally she updates the registration, and puts the same address again. Mr. Wheat will file a voter residency challenge based on the history that, within the last 12 months, the CCBOE has had two hearings regarding this specific address. The CCBOE will send her a hearing notice. Director Perlatti clarified that Ms. King's provisional ballot will be rejected as not a registered voter. Board Member McCafferty asked if voters are made aware that their provisional ballots were not counted. The Board discussed what determines if a notice is sent to a provisional voter and for the different notification categories be shared with the Board.

Chairman Curtis moved to approve the determination of the validity of provisional ballots and authorization to count provisional ballots from the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Agenda Item 5: Acknowledgment of resignation from, and appointment to elected office**

Chairman Curtis moved to acknowledge the resignation from, and appointment to elected office, as provided in the board packet. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **Agenda Item 6: Approval of an update to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Petition Protocols**

Chairman Curtis moved to approve an update to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Petition Protocols. The Board discussed the updates and determined the CCBOE should include additional disclaimer information. Chairman Curtis withdrew the motion. The Petition Protocols will be updated with additional disclaimers and presented at the April 9, 2024, Board Meeting.

#### **Agenda Item 7: Approval of the personnel agenda**

Chairman Curtis moved to approve the personnel agenda, as provided in the board packet. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election Update**

Deputy Director Kaloger gave an update on the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary. He stated the Election Support Department has completed the supply bag cleanout, and today, Berman's Moving and Storage will pick up and return equipment from the remaining voting locations. The Election Officials Department is completing the final round of proofing for the poll worker payroll. The payroll file will be sent to the County Fiscal Department later in the week. The CCBOE will complete the poll worker payroll within the four to six-week window. The Ballot Department has been rescanning the election day paper ballots, verifying the number of sheets scanned matches the number of sheets recorded from the voting machine's USBs. On April 5, 2024, the Ballot Department completed the post-election public test. The public is notified and able to attend the public test. The Registration Department will begin voter history once the provisional opening is completed. The department will also be entering voter registration cards



received since election day. Each department will conduct a lessons learned session to determine what can be improved for the next election. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the scanning of the ballot images was completed. Director Perlatti stated the election night process went well and that the Ballot Department has been able to merge all ballot images with the numeric results. The CCBOE will house and retain the ballot images. Director Perlatti stated that the CCBOE may conduct one automatic recount for the Brooklyn City School District Issue. There is currently a six-vote difference, and the provisional ballots and post-election absentees will be included at the certification at the April 9, 2024 board meeting. Should an automatic recount be needed, an additional board meeting would be necessary on the week of April 22, 2024.

### **Cleveland Magnet School Election Day Update**

Director Perlatti provided an update regarding Cleveland Magnet School, located on Chester Avenue in Cleveland, which is the voting location for Ward 7, Precincts S and T. On Election Night, the Ballot Department ascertained that no Precinct 7S ballots had been voted. However, there were voters who checked in on the electronic poll books (EPBs) for precinct 7S. The CCBOE discovered the issue on election night when going through the due diligence of checks and balances and comparing electronic check-ins to ballot scans. Precinct 7S had 43 EPB Check-ins, but zero election-day ballots were scanned. The CCBOE pulled the ballot box and discovered none of the ballot packets for Precinct S, Democratic, Republican, or unaffiliated had been opened. The Ballot Department had the memory stick and could balance the election results between the EPB check-ins and ballots voted in 7T. The ballots for both Cleveland 7S and 7T were identical, and the vote totals will be correct. When the CCBOE publishes the final reports, no Election Day votes will be recorded for 7S. However, voter history will be accurate as that information comes from the EPBs. The CCBOE investigated the matter and found on election day, the poll workers were checking the voters into the electronic poll book, but when it came time to issuing the ballots, they only issued ballots from precinct T. When the poll worker would scan a 7T ballot for a voter in 7S an error message would appear on the EPB book. The poll workers looked to the voting location manager (VLM) to instruct them, and the VLM wrongly instructed them to hit the ADA button, which allows a ballot to be issued without scanning a barcode. The Election Officials Department determined that the two poll workers working at the EPB would again go through poll worker training before the November Election. The VLM will not be rehired for future elections.

**Agenda Item 2: Certification of the official results of the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election**

Brian Cleary, Ballot Department Manager, presented information from the board packet regarding the certification of the official results from the November 7, 2023, General Election. Mr. Cleary stated that one automatic recount for Brooklyn City School District Issue 21 is scheduled for Monday, April 15, 2024, at 9:30 a.m. The requested recount deadline is Monday April 15, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. The Board discussed the recent changes in the voter identification laws from Ohio House Bill 458 and its impact on provisional voting. Board Member Davis Chappell requested an internal report and analysis to see what the impact has been. They discussed what measures can be taken to educate voters in preparation for the upcoming November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election.

Chairman Curtis moved to acknowledge the date, time, and place of the post-election audit for the March 19, 2024, Presidential Primary Election will be determined at the Certification of Recount meeting. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**Agenda Item 4: Approval of an update to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Petition Protocols**

Director Perlatti stated the CCBOE amended the Petition Protocols document to include safeguard disclaimer language. Board Member Davis Chappell noted one grammatical correction to be made to the document.

Board Member Davis Chappell stated she was pleased to see the Reservation of Rights language because there could be circumstances where additional parameters need to be imposed; it is, therefore, not limiting to the five protocol conditions.

Chairman Curtis moved to adopt the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Public Records Inspection Protocols. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Deputy Director Kaloger stated the Election Officials Department sent the poll worker payroll files to the County Fiscal Department, and poll workers can expect checks later in the week or early the following week. Director Perlatti stated once the requested recount window closes on Monday, April 15, 2024, the Candidate and Petition Services Department will begin sending out the Certificates of Nomination and Election to candidates. The Brooklyn City School District certification will be mailed after the Board certifies the automatic recount.

Chairman Curtis tossed a coin to determine the winner of the tie, and vanilla won the toss. The results of the Kid Ballots will be posted on the CCBOE website, and shared on social media. Chairman Curtis stated that every vote counts, as seen in today's Recount Results; eight votes determined the results of the bond issue. Chairman Curtis moved to certify the results of the March 2024 Primary Kids Ballot Mock Special Election. Board Member McCafferty seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

# Post-Election Audit Summary

## March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election

*DELEGATES-AT-LARGE AND ALTERNATES-AT-LARGE (REP)

There were 185,279 total ballots cast in the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election. A hand count was conducted of 2,011 ballots cast in the audited contest. The accuracy rate for the post-election audit is 100%.

On April 23, 2024, the Ballot Department conducted one Risk-Limiting Post-Election Audit for the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election. Audited race and batch details are provided below:

Our Risk-Limiting Audits were based upon the Kaplan-Markov method as explained by Philip B. Stark and Mark Lindeman. Auditing best practices recommend we split up the total ballots cast by precinct into multiple batch types. We utilized six batch types each consisting of one single ballot type category: Vote-by-Mail, Election Day, Early In-Person, Provisional, Post Vote-by-Mail, and Post Election Day.

A master spreadsheet was created for each contest with statistical formulas to determine the number of batches that must be audited in order to reach a 90% confidence level. This confidence level means the audit has at least a 90% probability of leading to a full recount if the apparent outcome is incorrect.

We used a “Probability Proportional to Error Bound with Replacement” selection method. We assigned numbers ranging from 000 through 999 for each batch within each contest. Unique ranges of numbers were allocated to specific batches based upon their error bound - i.e. the greater the possibility of a miscount within a batch, the more numbers assigned, and the more likely it is to be selected. For example, if a single batch has a high probability of a miscount, multiple numbers would be assigned to that single batch, making the random selection of that batch more likely during the audit. Each of those individual numbers might be randomly selected and included in the overall batch audit requirement, but the single batch to which those numbers are assigned would need to be audited only once. To obtain the precinct batch number we rolled differently colored dice numbered 0 - 9, each one of the colored dice representing one digit of the batch number.



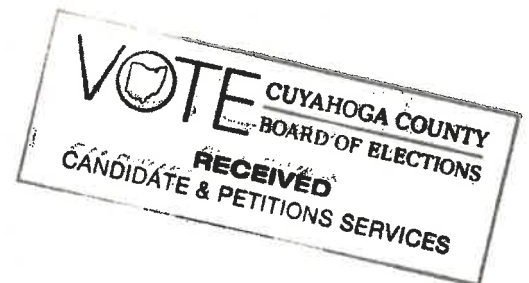

**SECTION 4. VACANCIES.**

Any vacancy in the Council, shall be filled in the first instance by the appointment, by a majority of the remaining members of the Council, of an individual qualified under this Charter to serve as a member of Council. In the event Council fails to fill any vacancy within forty-five (45) days of the occurrence of such vacancy, then the Mayor shall fill such vacancy within ten (10) days. The individual appointed to fill the vacancy shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified at an election as provided herein; provided, however, that if the vacancy in Council occurs in the year that the regular election for that office is already scheduled, then the person appointed shall hold office through December 31 of that year.

For any vacancy in Council not occurring in the year that the regular election for that office is scheduled, an election for the unexpired term shall be held at the next general election occurring more than one hundred and twenty (120) days after the date of the vacancy. The term of a person elected to fill the vacancy at such election shall begin at the first regularly scheduled meeting of Council following the certification of electoral results of such election and shall extend for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Subject to the provisions of this Section III-4, persons desiring to become candidates for the office in which the vacancy arose shall file nominating petitions, with the election authorities prescribed by general law, not later than 4:00 p.m. on the ninetieth (90th) day before such election. Such petitions shall not be signed by any electors more than one hundred eighty (180) days prior to such election. Other than with regard to the time limits in this section applicable to the filing and signature of petitions, such nominating petitions shall be subject to the requirements of Article VII, Section 3 of the Charter, including the number of required signatures.

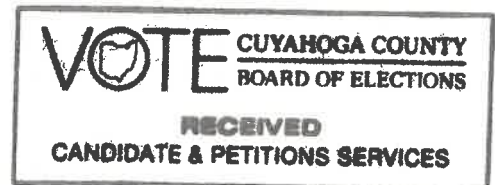

# March 19, 2024 General Election Early In-Person Election Officials Performance Report

## I. Opening and Closing EIP Voting Location

### A. Initial setup (First Day of Voting)

On the first day of Early In-Person (EIP) voting (February 21<sup>st</sup>), four Clear Cast Scanners were turned on and made ready for voting for the election. A zero report was generated to show the machines had no ballots that were scanned and tabulated for the election. At least one full-time staff member was part of a bipartisan team responsible for performing this operation. The team then signed off on the Zero Report and stored it with the respective security logbook. One Clear Cast Scanner was closed but left active to serve as a back-up scanner in the event of malfunction of the primary scanners. Two scanners were positioned in the main voting area, and one was placed by the exit of the ADA area.

Meanwhile, another team prepared the Print Now ballot printing on-demand stations for voting by logging into the program, removing stored blank ballot stock from the locked cabinets and loading it into the printers.

During the four weeks of EIP voting we kept three Clear Cast Scanner operational in the room and a fourth scanner was opened but kept in the locked ballot room storage area so that it could be deployed immediately if needed.

### B. Daily Opening and Closing of Polling Places

Unlike Clear Cast Scanners used at the polling locations on Election Day, the Clear Cast Scanners used at the EIP voting location are “opened” (turned on) and “closed” (shut down) each day, but technically polling is open until 7:30 p.m. on Election Night. Each day the BOE was open for voting during EIP (February 21-March 17), we reviewed the Clear Cast Scanner Audit Log for the opening and closing times of each Clear Cast Scanner used. Security seals and total votes were checked for discrepancies from closing the night before. There were never any discrepancies.

The scanners were opened and ready for voters fifteen minutes before the opening of voting each day. For closing times, we first ensured that no machine was shut down prior to closing times prescribed by SOS directive.

Expecting a voter turnout equal to, if not greater than the March 2020 Primary Election, we started with twelve full-time operators and three part-time (10 a.m. to 2 p.m.) operators. We planned to add three more full-time operators during the last week of voting and the last weekend of voting, but based on turnout through Week Two, we chose to not bring in the extra staff. The weekend before the election, we had a few full-time staff members from CPS and Registration present to handle an anticipated increase in voters.

### **C. Signing the Oath of Office**

Before Early In-Person voting began, a designee of the manager of CPS (Stephen Doell, Supervisor) administered the Oath to the Early In-Person Precinct Election Officials (EIP PEOs) orally and they, in turn, signed a written copy of the Oath.

### **D. Final close of Polls (Election Day 7:30 p.m.)**

The final close of polls for the Early In-Person vote center was Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. All machines were put through the nightly shut down process and emptied of the ballots. The machines were then sent to the Ballot Department on Election Day by a bipartisan team. The machines were completely shut down by Ballot Department staff at 7:30 p.m. election night and the vote tally memory sticks were removed and uploaded by the Ballot Department.

## **II. Self-Reporting of Problems**

The EIP PEOs are temporary employees hired to assist with the implementation of early voting and are directly supervised by full-time staff of the CCBOE at all times. In training, they are instructed to immediately inform the supervisors of any issues that arise. Therefore, after-the-fact reporting of incidents and ballot quantities by the temporary staff during Early In-Person Voting is not necessary.

## **III. Handling of Provisional Ballot**

The EIP voting staff issued a total of 112 Provisional ballots to voters throughout the election cycle. Of that total, 14 provisional ballots were issued on Election Day.

*Note: A total of eighteen EIP provisional ballots were rejected: eleven because the voter was not registered; five because the voters could not provide valid ID at the time of voting and did not present a valid ID before the close of EIP voting or the close of the cure period; and two because the voters provided invalid addresses.*

## **IV. Reconciliation After Polls are Closed – Delivering Ballots to the Ballot Department**

### **A. Completing Reconciliation Duties**

The number of ballots issued cast at the CCBOE Early In-Person voting center was 8,188 including 70 Take-Away ballots. *Note: A Take-Away ballot is like a Vote-by-Mail ballot in that the voter completes an application to receive their ballot. The ballot must be returned in the Identification Envelope and is under the same deadlines as a Vote-by-Mail ballot.*

### **B. Delivering Ballots to the Ballot Department**

Staff emptied the collection bins for each scanner every day and kept the ballots in separate stacks by scanner number. Ballots were then sorted to the precinct level daily starting at the beginning of the second week of voting. After closing the Clear Cast Scanner at the end of the EIP voting period the machine was emptied of ballots one last time and sorted to precinct level. The ballots were delivered to the Ballot Department by Election Support staff along with the Clear Cast Scanners.

# Precinct Election Official Performance Summary

## March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election

The standard guidance in conducting the PEO Performance Review requires processes and procedures to be evaluated as directed by the Secretary of State (SOS). The workers demonstrated overall knowledge, conducted themselves in a professional manner, and participated in an Election Day with few procedural errors. According to the criteria set by the Ohio Election Official Manual, as well as the feedback gathered from the Call Center, post-election surveys from workers and voters, and internal staff, we met our expectations and accomplished our goals overall.

## SUMMARY FOR VOTER REGISTRATION CHALLENGES AT 11021 EAST BLVD:

On March 8, 2024, Mr. Mikhail Alterman, a registered voter in Beachwood, Precinct E, submitted eight (8) SOS prescribed *Form #257s, Challenge of Right to Vote and Correction of Registration List* that challenges the right to vote using the address of 11021 East Blvd in Cleveland for the following individuals: Alice Zhang, Julia Kim, Cerianne Huang, August Dubeau, Kiana Lilly, Curtis Li, Ruby Pine, and Tatum Hodgson.

### **General Information**

- When the voter challenges were received on March 8, 2024, there are a total of forty-seven (47) voters that listed 11021 East Blvd, Cleveland as their address in the voter registration database including the eight (8) voters that were challenged by Mr. Alterman.

### **Challenge Notes**

- Mikhail Alterman indicates on his voter residency challenge:
  - 11021 East Blvd is not a residential address but that of the Cleveland Institute of Music (CIM).
  - CIM has its dorms/on-campus housing on Hazel Dr. in Cleveland.
- Upon consultation with the CCBOE's Senior Geographic Information System (GIS) Technician, it is determined that 11021 East Blvd is indeed the Cleveland Institute of Music and **not** a residential address.
- Since sending the hearing notices, two (2) voters have updated their voter registrations to an acceptable residential address. This leaves six (6) voters that are being challenged that are still registered at the 11021 East Blvd address.

### **CCBOE Comments**

Updated voter registration to a valid residential address and cancellation is no longer required.

## **SUMMARY FOR VOTER REGISTRATION CHALLENGES AT 11459 MAYFIELD RD:**

On April 15, 2024, Mr. Hasani Wheat, a registered voter in Cleveland, Ward 1-F, submitted thirteen (13) SOS prescribed *Form #257s, Challenge of Right to Vote and Correction of Registration List* that challenges the right to vote using the address of 11459 Mayfield Rd in Cleveland for the following individuals: George Scott, Patricia Antoine, Ian Charnas, Irene Day, Lori Franklin, Robert Huck, Charles Scott, Sarah Almahdali, Tania Carter, Chester Starks, Jr., Debora Pruitt Sullivan, Isaiah Freeman, and Alexander Rodriguez.

### ***General Information***

- On February 2, 2024, the CCBOE Registration Department mailed notices to fifteen (15) voters that were registered at the UPS Store located at 11459 Mayfield Rd, Cleveland, Ohio. The notice stated the individuals needed to update their registration to a residential address and were provided with a registration card.
  - Two of the fifteen voters updated their registrations upon receiving the CCBOE's notice.
- The thirteen remaining individuals registered at 11459 Mayfield Rd were placed in a Must Vote Provisional Status on February 21, 2024 following the close of registration.
- Once the March 19<sup>th</sup> Presidential Primary was certified, Manager Wheat challenged the thirteen voters still registered at 11459 Mayfield Rd. on April 15, 2024.

### ***Challenge Notes***

- The CCBOE's Senior Geographic Information System (GIS) Technician, John Eddy, has determined 11459 Mayfield Rd is **not** a residential address and serves as a commercial PO Box.

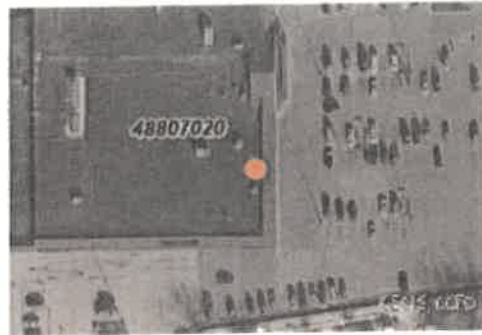

## **SUMMARY FOR NORMA KING:**

Mr. Hasani Wheat, a registered voter in Cleveland, Ward 1-F, submitted on April 12, 2024, a SOS prescribed Form #257, Challenge of Right to Vote and Correction of Registration List on Mrs. Norma King. The voter registration database currently lists Mrs. King's address at 1735 Elsinore Ave., East Cleveland.

### ***Previous SOS Form #257 Challenges***

- On May 23, 2023, the CCBOE conducted a residency hearing regarding Norma King's previous voter registration at the 1735 Elsinore Ave. address. The Board Members voted in the affirmative to grant the challenge and cancel Mrs. King's voter registration at 1735 Elsinore Ave.
- Subsequently, the Board Members instructed the Director to submit Mrs. King's matter to the SOS Public Integrity Unit for their review. The SOS review is still active with no final determinations made on the matter.
- On November 28, 2023, a second hearing was held regarding Mrs. King re-registering at the 1735 Elsinore Ave. address. The Board Members voted in the affirmative to cancel Mrs. King's registration at 1735 Elsinore Ave. based on the record of the Board's prior hearing and the testimony under oath that was given by Mrs. King on May 23, 2023.

### ***Norma King's Actions Since November 28<sup>th</sup>***

- Norma King cast a Provisional Ballot at her polling location based on the 1735 Elsinore Ave registration address in the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election.

### ***CCBOE Comments***

- Mr. Wheat is challenging Mrs. King's voter registration based on testimony from the Board's previous challenge hearings of May 23, 2023 and November 28, 2023.
- The Board Members at the May 23<sup>rd</sup> hearing heard testimony from Mrs. King regarding her residency.
- The only record in the custody of the CCBOE regarding Mrs. King's voter registration residency since the November 28, 2023 hearing is her Provisional Envelope from the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election.

**CONTRACT FOR  
ELECTION ASSET INVENTORY MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE SYSTEM  
BETWEEN THE  
CUYAHOGA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS

TENEX SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS, INC.**

This Contract is made and entered into the 25th day of November, 2019, by and between the **CUYAHOGA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS** (the "BOE"), 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, through its Director and Chair, under the authority Section 3501.301 of the Ohio Revised Code and BOE resolution, and **TENEX SOFTWARE SOLUTIONS, INC.** ("Contractor"), 5021 W Laurel St, Tampa, Florida, 33604 a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Florida, through its duly authorized representative.

**RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the BOE conducted a competitive process to select a contractor to provide and maintain a software solution for organizing and managing an election asset inventory system ("Asset Inventory System") through a Request for Bids ("RFB") No. 47082 issued on October 20, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor submitted an offer on November 1, 2019 ("Bid") in response to RFB No. 47082 to provide the necessary supplies and maintenance support for the Asset Inventory System in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in the RFB No. 47082 for the compensation described in the Bid; and

WHEREAS, the BOE finds the Contractor's Bid responsive and acceptable as the lowest and best submitted and selects the Contractor to furnish the supplies necessary to deliver and maintain the support for the Asset Inventory System in accordance with the terms, conditions and provisions contained in this Contract.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the payments and the mutual promises contained in this Contract, the parties agree as follows:

**ARTICLE I – SCOPE OF SERVICES**

**A. Generally.** By executing this Contract, the BOE accepts and the Contractor agrees to be bound by the Contractor's Bid, incorporated herein as Exhibit A, and the BOE's RFB No. 47082, incorporated herein as Exhibit B, the subject to any changes or modifications that may be made by this Contract. Exhibit A and Exhibit B is incorporated as if fully rewritten herein whether or not physically attached to this Contract. In the event of any conflict between provisions contained in the Exhibit A and the Exhibit B, the Exhibit B shall control.

**B. Specific Services.** The Contractor is retained to supplement the regularly employed staff of the BOE to furnish the supplies necessary for providing, installing, configuring and maintaining a software solution for organizing and managing an election asset inventory system ("Asset

Inventory System”). The Contractor shall render the specific services identified and described in Exhibit A and Exhibit B.

**C. License.** Throughout the Initial Term and any Renewal Term(s), the Contractor hereby grants to the Commission, for the purposes set forth in this Contract, an irrevocable, non-exclusive, royalty free, non-transferrable, fully paid up right and license to use, reproduce (for back-up or transition purposes), modify, adapt and disclose, and sublicense others to use, reproduce (for back-up and transition purposes), modify, and adapt on the Commission’s behalf, the software and documentation necessary to operate the Asset Inventory System that allows an unlimited number of end users to use the Asset Inventory System. The License shall include all updates, enhancements, modifications, upgrades, revisions, replacements, upgrades made to or in the place of software or any related documentation including, but not limited to, those that corrects errors, correct safety hazards, to support the Asset Inventory System, and all error corrections, patches and bug fixes and any other derivative works created by Contractor during the Term. The Contractor shall provide all revisions, updates, modifications or upgrades as part of its Warranty and Maintenance services described in the BOE’s RFB No. 47082 and any other routine system updates, modifications or maintenance work made to the software that is required to correct errors, patches or bug fixes or to operate and maintain the Asset Inventory System without any additional compensation.

**D. Performance Warranty.** In addition to the warranties described in Exhibit B, the Contractor and its staff shall provide the services contemplated under the Contract in a manner consistent with the same degree of care, skill and diligence as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by members of the profession, currently performing under similar circumstances. The Contractor shall be responsible for the quality services rendered under the Contract and shall promptly make necessary corrections resulting from its negligence, errors or omissions without any additional compensation. The Contractor’s duty of care shall extend to the BOE, and the Contractor shall be and remain liable to the BOE in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the BOE caused by the Contractor’s negligent acts, performance, errors or omissions. If no such standards exist, then the Contractor shall perform its services in a workmanlike manner with a reasonable degree of care, skill and diligence and as described in this Contract.

## **ARTICLE 2 – TIME OF PERFORMANCE**

**A. Term.** This Contract shall become binding and go into effect only upon the date (the “Effective Date”) that the last of each of the following has occurred:

1. The Contractor has properly submitted the required documents specified in the RFB;
2. The Contract has been duly awarded by the Cuyahoga County BOE of Elections;
3. The Contractor has satisfied all insurance and bonding requirements and timely furnished required documentation, as specified in this Contract and the RFB, to the BOE;
4. The Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer has certified the availability of the funds necessary for this Contract and encumbered the appropriate amounts in accordance with the BOE’s practices; and
5. The Contract has been executed by the BOE or a duly authorized designee.

The term of this Agreement and the Contractor's performance of services shall begin on the Effective Date, and shall, unless sooner canceled or terminated pursuant to the provisions herein, expire on May 31, 2024 ("Initial Term"). The Contractor shall diligently perform its contractual obligation to promptly install and configure the Asset Inventory System so its production stage occurs in accordance with an agreed upon schedule.

**B. Renewal Options.** The BOE shall have the option to renew the Contract for five additional one-year periods ("Renewal Term") exercisable upon notice to the Contractor at least 30 days before the expiration of the Initial Term or any Renewal Term.

### **ARTICLE 3 – PAYMENTS**

**A. Contract Fee.** The BOE shall pay the Contractor \$40,000 for the performance required under this Contract, as described in Exhibit A, during the initial 18-months period occurring after acceptance of the Asset Inventory System through May 31, 2021. Thereafter, the BOE shall pay the Contractor \$38,000 on an annual basis throughout the duration of the Term and any Renewal Terms.

**B. Payments.** The BOE shall not make payment until the Asset Inventory System is installed and fully accepted to the satisfaction of the BOE. Thereafter, the BOE will make payments to the Contractor pursuant the verified performance and annually thereafter based on verified invoices.

**C. Reimbursable Expenses.** No extra charges will be assessed for travel time or incidental expenses except as hereinafter provided. The BOE will not reimburse the Contractor for any expenses incurred (such as travel expenses) without prior agreement to incur such expenses or adequate documentation supporting such expenses.

**D. Invoices.** The Contractor will submit invoices to the BOE in a form agreeable to the BOE and containing the contract number in the month following the performance of the services. The Contractor shall render its bills for services to the BOE on or about the 10th day of the month after any such services are performed to Cuyahoga BOE of Elections, Fiscal Department, 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, 44115. Undisputed invoices shall be due and payable by the BOE within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt thereof. Invoices for any other amounts will be submitted to the BOE as the amounts come due. Invoices shall be accompanied by such supporting documentation as required by the BOE. The BOE may withhold payment for services that have not been properly performed or completed, and shall not be responsible for cost overruns incurred by the Contractor.

**E. Taxes.** The BOE is a tax-exempt entity and will provide the Contractor a copy of the BOE's tax exemption certificate. The BOE shall not assume responsibility for the payment of any personal property taxes for any materials not owned by the BOE, nor shall the BOE pay any insurance premiums for any coverage of any property not owned by the County. No conditions shall alter this statement.

Directive 2024-06; Data Collection, Notice, and Cancellation  
Procedures for Completion of 2020 National Change of Address  
(NCOA) Process and Past Due Cancellations

RELEASED: May 2, 2024

## SUMMARY

- *Directive 2024-06* requires the CCBOE to provide a list of registrations in active-confirmation status to the SOS as a result of the 2020 NCOA Process pursuant to *Directive 2020-10*.
- By noon on May 21, the CCBOE must upload the registration records that will receive a registration readiness notice. The SOS will review the data, then authorize the CCBOE to mail the notices, which must be completed by May 31.
- The CCBOE must provide a pre-cancellation list to the SOS, but only after processing all outstanding voter registration transactions by May 13 and all duplicate registrations by May 17.
- The registration readiness notice (Form 255-A-3) must be mailed to each registration that meets the criteria by May 31.
- By noon on July 15, the CCBOE must upload the spreadsheet containing the records of registrations pending cancellation pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process to the SOS.
- All identified records (having passed SOS review) must be cancelled on July 22. Prior to cancelling any records, the CCBOE must update all recent voter-initiated activity.
- The SOS Office of Data Analytics and Archive has identified potential past due cancellations. Any registration that is identified as a past due cancellation (per instructions in this *Directive*) must receive a registration readiness notice.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### I. REGISTRATION READINESS NOTICES PURSUANT TO 2020 NCOA PROCESS

Before mailing registration readiness notices, the CCBOE must submit a “registration readiness file” to the SOS. It must process any outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicates before submitting the registration readiness file. Prior to submitting the registration readiness file, the CCBOE must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all outstanding voter registration transactions by the close of business on **May 13**.
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **May 17**.

The CCBOE must pause entering voter registration registrations between **May 14** and **May 21**. By **12:00 noon on May 21**, the CCBOE must upload the spreadsheet containing the registration records that will receive the registration readiness notice.

The SOS will review the CCBOE’s data. Once the review is complete, the CCBOE must then send, by forwardable mail, the registration readiness notice (Form 255-A-3) to each registration that meets the criteria. The CCBOE must finish mailing the notices by **May 31**. The CCBOE is eligible for

reimbursement of actual costs for printing and mailing registration readiness notices sent pursuant to this *Directive*. Details are included in this *Directive*.

## **II. CANCELLATIONS PURSUANT TO THE 2020 NCOA PROCESS**

### **A. PRE-CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2020 NCOA PROCESS**

Before completing any cancellations pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process, the CCBOE must submit a “pre-cancellation file” to the SOS. Prior to providing the pre-cancellation file, the CCBOE must process all outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicate registrations. To meet the goal of resolving all duplicate registrations prior to providing the pre-cancellation spreadsheet, each board must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all voter registration transactions received by the close of business on **July 11**.
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **July 12**.

No earlier than the afternoon of **July 15**, boards may resume processing voter registration transactions. By **12:00 noon on Friday, July 15**, the CCBOE must upload the spreadsheet containing the records of registrations that are pending cancellation pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process. The CCBOE is prohibited from cancelling any registration that appears on a “Do Not Cancel” list from the SOS.

### **B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2020 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS**

Once the SOS reviews the list of voter registration records pending cancellation, the CCBOE will receive an email instructing it on how to proceed with cancelling the registrations. Prior to cancelling any records, the CCBOE must update voter-initiated activity for any voter who signed a petition that was verified by the board or had any other type of voter-initiated activity. All identified records must be cancelled on **July 22**. By **12:00 noon on July 23**, the CCBOE must upload a spreadsheet containing the registrations that received the registration readiness notice and were cancelled.

## **III. ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS – PAST DUE CANCELATIONS**

### **A. PRIOR GENERAL VOTER RECORDS MAINTENANCE PROCESSES**

The SOS Office of Data Analytics and Archive has identified potential past due cancellations. The CCBOE is required to review its voter registration database for records that were (1) previously identified in past NCOA or Supplemental Process directives; (2) have not engaged in voter-initiated activity since receiving a confirmation notice; but (3) were not removed from its voter registration database. Any registration that is identified pursuant to this section must receive a registration readiness notice.

### **B. ROUTINE CANCELATIONS PURSUANT TO THE ELECTION OFFICIAL MANUAL**

The CCBOE must fulfill its obligation for cancellations that are NOT part of the state’s NCOA Process or Supplemental Process (commonly referred to as the state’s general voter records

maintenance program). Any registration identified pursuant to this section of the *Directive* must receive a registration readiness notice.

**C. INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTRATION READINESS NOTICES PURSUANT TO ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS**

Before mailing registration readiness notices, the CCBOE must submit a “registration readiness file” to the SOS. It must process any outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicates before submitting the registration readiness file.

**IV. CANCELATIONS PURSUANT TO ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES**

**A. PRE-CANCELATION SPREADSHEET: ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES**

The CCBOE must follow the same instructions detailed in Section II (A).

**B. CANCELATION SPREADSHEET: ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES**

The CCBOE must follow the same instructions detailed in Section II (B).

**V. MAINTAINING RECORDS OF CANCELLATION**

The CCBOE must work with DIMS to ensure its voter registration system maintains and can produce a list of voter registrations cancelled pursuant to this *Directive*. The CCBOE must record all the following in its voter registration system:

- The date that it mailed a registration readiness notice to an elector;
- If the elector responds to the notice, the date on which the elector responded; and
- If the elector does not respond to the notice, the date the registration was cancelled.

Re: Data Collection, Notice, and Cancellation Procedures for Completion of 2020 National Change of Address (NCOA) Process and Past Due Cancellations

**BACKGROUND**

State and federal law require maintaining accurate voter registration records.<sup>1</sup> The Secretary of State's office is committed to encouraging all eligible voters to remain active voters. Therefore, this Directive requires each county board of elections to provide a list of registrations in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2020 NCOA Process pursuant to [Directive 2020-10](#) to the Secretary of State's office. This Directive also requires each county board of elections to provide a list of past due cancellations, including registrations in active-confirmation status that have remained inactive for four consecutive years or more. The Secretary of State's office will publish the list of registrations in active-confirmation status to encourage a response to the notices that will be sent to registrations on the list.

This Directive requires the boards of elections to send a registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 4/2024](#)) to each registration that is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2020 NCOA Process.

Per the timelines set forth in this Directive, boards must provide a pre-cancellation list to the Secretary of State's office, but only after (1) uploading all voter history from the March 19, 2024 election, if applicable, and (2) processing pending voter registration transactions after the election. Cancellations will occur in two phases as outlined in the instructions below.

**INSTRUCTIONS**

**I. REGISTRATION READINESS NOTICES PURSUANT TO THE 2020 NCOA PROCESS**

Before mailing registration readiness notices, boards must submit a "registration readiness file" to the Secretary of State's office. Boards must process any outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicates before submitting the registration readiness file.

Prior to submitting the registration readiness file to the Secretary of State's office, each board of elections must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all outstanding voter registration transactions by the close of business on **May 13, 2024**.<sup>2</sup>

2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **May 17, 2024**.

This timeline must be followed to ensure that each board resolves duplicate registrations without being impacted by another board's processing of voter registration transactions. Each board must pause entering voter registration registrations between **May 14 and May 21, 2024**.

**By 12:00PM on May 21, 2024**, each board of elections must upload the spreadsheet containing the registration records that will receive the registration readiness notice. Note that every record on the spreadsheet must receive a registration readiness notice, unless there is voter-initiated activity prior to the notice being mailed.

All boards must utilize the same spreadsheet format, containing the following information:

- County Number
- County Name
- State Voter ID
- Cancel Reason (NCOA)
- Registration Date
- Last Voted Date
- First Name
- Last Name
- Address
- Address 2
- City
- State
- Zip Code
- Voter Status
- Confirmation Notice Mail Date

The spreadsheet must be uploaded to the board's SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- The record is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2020 NCOA process;
- The record must be contained on the 2020 Out-of-County NCOA list;
- The Out-of-County Confirmation Notice must have been mailed no later than June 30, 2020;
- There must be no voter history on or after April 28, 2020;
- The registration date is before February 18, 2020;
- The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the mailing of the registration readiness notice. Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid

absentee ballot application, registering to vote, updating or confirming an address with a board of elections or the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections;<sup>3</sup> and

- The record does not appear on the “Do Not Cancel” list. This list will be provided prior to the deadline to upload the list of identified records.

The Secretary of State’s staff will review each board’s data. If the outcome of the review is satisfactory, the Secretary of State’s office will email each board to authorize the board to mail registration readiness notices.

Boards of elections, by forwardable mail, must mail the registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 4/2024](#)), to each registration that meets the criteria above. Each board must finish mailing the notices by **May 31, 2024**. The “Your Voter Registration Information” box at the top of page two of Form 255-A-3 must be populated with date issued, name and address. If the elector replies to the notice by updating or confirming the elector’s address at any time prior to the anticipated cancelation date, the elector’s registration must not be canceled. Each board utilizing a vendor to print the notices must inform the vendor of the timeframe associated with this mailing to ensure the deadline is achieved. The board must review and follow the outsourcing required mailings section in [Chapter 2, page 46 of the Election Official Manual](#).

Boards must include a courtesy reply mail return envelope with each notice. As a reminder, each board must incorporate the use of the Official Election Mail logo on both outbound and inbound envelopes used with the registration readiness notices. Each board should consult with its Election Mail Coordinator for assistance in preparing for this mailing. Boards must ensure proper quality control is performed to ensure the registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 4/2024](#)) and the courtesy reply mail return envelope are properly printed and included in the outbound mailing envelope. This mailing should be designed to encourage recipients to read the contents.

Counties are eligible for reimbursement of actual costs for printing and mailing registration readiness notices sent pursuant to this Directive. If your board would like to be reimbursed, please follow the instructions below and email copies of documents to Ann Boehnlein at [aboehnlein@ohiosos.gov](mailto:aboehnlein@ohiosos.gov). Please submit your board’s reimbursement request by August 16, 2024.

#### **A. REIMBURSEMENT INSTRUCTIONS**

A county seeking reimbursement for the registration readiness mailings that were sent as a result of this Directive must include:

1. The registration readiness mailing spreadsheet detailing total costs.
2. A contract or Memorandum of Understanding with a third-party mailing vendor (if applicable).
3. Invoices from each vendor/supplier.

- a. If the mailing is completed in-house by the board, please include an itemized list which describes each item and cost and how the costs were determined. Please include any back-up documentation available for proof of these costs.
  - b. Only actual costs for postage or items used for this mailing will be reimbursed. If, for example, the board purchased 1,000 envelopes, but only 100 were used for this mailing, the board will be reimbursed only for the supplies that were used on a cost-per-unit basis.
4. County-paid vouchers (proof that the payment to the vendor/supplier was made).
  5. If the board performed this mailing in-house, related expenses for reimbursement can still be submitted. When submitting the spreadsheet and documentation for reimbursement, in the body of the email please provide a breakdown of the calculation of costs for envelopes, printing, and postage per registrant.

## **II. CANCELATIONS PURSUANT TO THE 2020 NCOA PROCESS**

Boards of election must adhere to the following instructions before proceeding to any cancelation.

### **A. PRE-CANCELATION SPREADSHEET: 2020 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS**

Before completing any cancelations pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process, all boards must submit a “pre-cancelation file” to the Secretary of State’s office. Prior to providing the pre-cancelation file, boards must process all outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicate registrations. To meet the goal of resolving all duplicate registrations prior to providing the pre-cancelation spreadsheet, each board must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all voter registration transactions received by the close of business on **July 11, 2024**.<sup>4</sup>
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **July 12, 2024**.

This timeline must be followed to ensure that each board resolves duplicate registrations<sup>5</sup> without being impacted by another board’s processing of voter registration transactions. No earlier than the afternoon of **July 15, 2024**, boards may resume processing voter registration transactions.

**By 12:00PM on July 15, 2024**, each board must upload the spreadsheet containing the records of registrations that are pending cancelation pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process:

The pre-cancellation file format is the same as for the registration readiness file and must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- The record is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2020 NCOA Process.
- The record appears on the 2020 Out-of-County NCOA list.
- The record’s registration date is before February 18, 2020.
- The record does not contain voter history on or after April 28, 2020.
- The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the pre-cancellation list. Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid absentee ballot application, registering to vote, updating or confirming an address with a board of elections or the BMV, or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections.<sup>6</sup>
- The record appears on the registration readiness notice spreadsheet.

Boards are prohibited from canceling any registration that appears on a “Do Not Cancel” list from the Secretary of State’s office.

#### **B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2020 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS**

Once the Secretary of State’s office reviews the list of voter registration records pending cancellation, each board will receive an email instructing the board to proceed with canceling the registrations. The boards must not cancel any registration until receipt of that email. Prior to canceling any records, boards must update voter-initiated activity for any voter who signed a petition that was verified by the board or had any other type of voter-initiated activity. All identified records must be canceled on **July 22, 2024**. If a board of elections is holding a special or charter election within 30 days of that date, the board must notify the Secretary of State’s office as soon as that is known, so that an alternative date can be set.

Boards of elections must not cancel any registration pursuant to the 2020 NCOA Process to which any of the following apply:

1. The registration appears on the “Do Not Cancel” list;
2. The registration is impacted by a voter registration vendor’s error known to the board;
3. The board is missing voter history in their county voter registration database from any election between April 28, 2020 Presidential Primary Election through the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election; or

4. The registration appears on the Secretary of State’s Statewide Voter Registration Database (“SWVRD”) in “active” status.

By 12:00PM on July 23, 2024, each board must upload the spreadsheet containing the registrations that received the registration readiness notice and were canceled. The cancellation file format is the same as described above for the registration readiness file and pre-cancellation file. The cancellation file must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format.

### **III. ADDITIONAL LIST MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS – PAST DUE CANCELATIONS**

#### **A. PRIOR GENERAL VOTER RECORDS MAINTENANCE PROCESSES**

As required by state and federal law, boards of elections are required to maintain accurate voter registration databases. As part of an ongoing data integrity review, the Secretary of State’s Office of Data Analytics and Archive identified potential past due cancellations. To identify any past due cancellations each board of elections is required to review their voter registration databases for records that were (1) previously identified in past NCOA or Supplemental Process directives;<sup>7</sup> (2) have not engaged in voter-initiated activity<sup>8</sup> since receiving a confirmation notice (during the period of the appropriate four-year anniversary date subsequent to the mailing of the confirmation notice); but (3) were not removed from the board’s voter registration databases. Any registration that is identified pursuant to this section must receive a registration readiness notice, as described below in Section C.

#### **B. ROUTINE CANCELATIONS PURSUANT TO THE ELECTION OFFICIAL MANUAL**

Each county board of elections must fulfill its obligations for cancellations that are NOT part of the state’s NCOA Process or Supplemental Process (commonly referred to as the state’s general voter records maintenance program).

These obligations include, but are not limited to, cancellations where: (1) a voter’s acknowledgement notice was returned undeliverable and (2) certain information in the voter’s records did not match BMV/SSA records.<sup>9</sup> As part of the same ongoing data integrity review, the Secretary of State’s Office of Data Analytics and Archive identified potential past due cancellations including where a voter’s acknowledgement notice was returned undeliverable and where certain information in the voter’s records did not match BMV/SSA records. To identify any past due cancellations each board of elections is required to review their voter registration databases for: (1) records that were placed in confirmation status because a voter’s acknowledgement notice was returned undeliverable or certain information in the voter’s records did not match BMV/SSA records;<sup>10</sup> (2) have not engaged in voter-initiated activity<sup>11</sup> since receiving a confirmation notice

(during the period of the appropriate four-year anniversary date subsequent to the mailing of the confirmation notice); but (3) were not removed from the board’s voter registration databases. All boards must compile a separate .csv in the following format, containing the following information:

The spreadsheet must be uploaded to the board's SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- The record is and has been in confirmation status prior to June 30, 2020;
- The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity after June 30, 2020, Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid absentee ballot application, registering to vote, updating, or confirming an address with a board of elections or the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections; and
- Record did not appear on an out-of-county NCOA list after June 30, 2020.

### **C. MAINTAINING RECORDS OF CANCELATION**

Each board must work with its voter registration vendor to ensure that its county voter registration system maintains and can produce a list of voter registrations canceled pursuant to this Directive. Boards must record all of the following in their county's voter registration system:

- The date that it mailed a registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 4/2024](#)) to an elector; and
- If the elector responds to the notice, the date on which the elector responded; and
- If the elector does not respond to the notice, the date the registration was canceled.

Boards of elections must maintain and make available for public inspection and copying at a reasonable cost all records concerning the implementation of programs and activities conducted for the purpose of ensuring the accuracy and currency of registration lists, including the names and addresses of all registered electors sent confirmation notices and whether the elector responded to the confirmation notice.<sup>17</sup>
