The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Meeting began at 9:31 a.m. Hereinafter referred to as the CCBOE/Board.

Chairman Hastings noted that Board Members Davis Chappell and Stickan were in attendance. Board Member McCafferty was excused from today's meeting.

Chairman Hastings moved to excuse Board Member McCafferty's absence. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 1: Approval of the minutes from the May 24, 2022, June 6, 2022, and June 8, 2022, Board Meetings

Board Member Davis Chappell abstained from approving the June 8, 2022, Board Minutes.

Chairman Hastings moved to approve the minutes from the May 24, 2022, June 6, 2022, and June 8, 2022, Board Meetings. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 2: Acknowledgment of Secretary of State Directives and Memorandum: Directive 2022-37: Court Order Impacting the August 2, 2022, Primary Election for Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Montgomery, and Perry County Boards of Elections; Directive 2022-38: Help America Vote Act ("HAVA") Funds, Security Improvements, and Vendor Contracts; Directive 2022-39: Court Order Impacting the August 2, 2022, Primary Election for Hamilton County Board of Elections; Directive 2022-40: Unofficial and Official Canvasses of the August 2, 2022, Primary/Special Election; Memorandum 2022-04: Responsibilities of Sheriffs and Chiefs of Police in the August 2, 2022, Election

Board Member Davis Chappell stated Directive 2022-38 included numerous deadlines and an extensive checklist. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the County Information Technology (IT) Department also received copies of the Directive. Deputy Director Kaloger stated the directives are shared with the County IT Department. The CCBOE will provide ongoing monthly updates to the Board Members.

Narrative that is underlined in the CCBOE minutes relates to a motion that was acted on by the Board.

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the Secretary of State Directives and Memorandum: Directive 2022-37: Court Order Impacting the August 2, 2022, Primary Election for Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Montgomery, and Perry County Boards of Elections; Directive 2022-38: Help America Vote Act (“HAVA”) Funds, Security Improvements, and Vendor Contracts; Directive 2022-39: Court Order Impacting the August 2, 2022, Primary Election for Hamilton County Board of Elections; Directive 2022-40: Unofficial and Official Canvasses of the August 2, 2022, Primary/Special Election; Memorandum 2022-04: Responsibilities of Sheriffs and Chiefs of Police in the August 2, 2022, Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 3: Final approval of the ballot order for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election

Chairman Hastings moved to approve the final ballot order for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 4: Acknowledgment of the Ballot Proofs for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election in accordance with the Ballot Proofing Policy approved by the Board at the March 12, 2021, Board Meeting

Board Member Davis Chappell stated there was an issue with the proofing of ballots in the May 3, 2022, Primary Election and asked what preventative changes were made for the August 2, 2022, Primary and future elections. Deputy Director Kaloger stated in addition to the proofing; the CCBOE has also added testing the ballot bar codes with electronic poll books to ensure the ballots are read correctly by the electronic poll books.

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the Ballot Proofs for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election in accordance with the Ballot Proofing Policy approved by the Board at the March 12, 2021, Board Meeting. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 5: Acknowledgment of candidates and issue withdrawals

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the candidates and issue withdrawals as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 6: Acknowledgment of resignation from and appointments to elected office

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the resignation from and appointments to elected office as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 7: Acknowledgment of PEO Performance Report for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election

Marlene Robinson Statler, Election officials Assistant Manager, presented information from the board packet concerning the Precinct Election Official (PEO) Performance Report.

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the PEO Performance Report for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 8: Authorization to pay: 287 Voting Location Managers x \$275 = \$78,925; 316 Voting Location Deputies x \$275 = \$86,900; 2,868 Precinct Election Officials x \$250 = \$717,000; 287 Sanitation Precinct Election Officials x \$200 = \$57,400; 150 Election Substitute Officials x \$100 = \$15,000 for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election

Board Member Davis Chappell asked what the total estimated cost of the August 2, 2022, Primary Election for Cuyahoga County. Deputy Director stated cost is anticipated to be \$3 million for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election and the total for both the May 3, 2022, and August 2, 2022, Elections will be approximately \$6 million.

Chairman Hastings asked if Sanitation Precinct Election Officials are also Election Officials. Deputy Director Kaloger stated they are trained as back-ups for several basic operations to provide coverage when needed.

Chairman Hastings moved to authorize to pay: 287 Voting Location Managers x \$275 = \$78,925; 316 Voting Location Deputies x \$275 = \$86,900; 2,868 Precinct Election Officials x \$250 = \$717,000; 287 Sanitation Precinct Election Officials x \$200 = \$57,400; 150 Election Substitute Officials x \$100 = \$15,000 for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 9: Final authorization for the allocation of voting booths for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. Allocation quantities are based on social distancing and room size per polling location. A total of 4,591 voting booths will be allocated + 724 DS200 precinct scanners + 287 ADA AutoMark voting units, and 826 Electronic Poll Books

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the final authorization of the allocation of voting booths for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. Allocation quantities are based on social distancing and room size per polling location. A total of 4,591 voting booths will be allocated + 724 DS200 precinct scanners + 287 ADA AutoMark voting units, and 826 Electronic Poll Books. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 10: Authorization to process payment in the amount not-to-exceed \$46,600 for 93 private voting locations, 3 CMHA properties, and one Zone station being used for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election

Chairman Hastings moved to authorize to process payment in the amount not-to-exceed \$46,600 for 93 private voting locations, 3 CMHA properties, and one Zone station being used for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 11: Approval of vouchers

Kendra Zusy, Fiscal Services Manager, stated the cost of mailing the August 2, 2022, Primary Election Voter Information Guide to each voter household was less than what the Board previously approved. The former Board-approved cost was based on mailing the card to each registered voter.

Chairman Hastings moved to approve of vouchers set forth in the agenda. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 12: Approval of the personnel agenda

Chairman Hastings moved to approve the personnel agenda as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

Deputy Director Kaloger stated the August 2, 2022, Primary Election includes candidates for the Ohio House, Ohio Senate, and State Central Committee. The May 3, 2022, Primary had an 18% voter turnout, and the CCBOE anticipates a 15% turnout for August. The Election Officials Department has trained 3,194 precinct election officials and polling location managers, which is 85% of the CCBOEs goal. In-person training will continue until July 23, 2022, and then refresher Zoom, and Practice Makes Perfect classes will be available. On July 11, 2022, the CCBOE participated in a successful Poll Worker Recruitment Day at the Cleveland Zoo. The CCBOE is continuing to recruit workers and ride-along's for Election Night.

Early in-person (EIP) voting has processed a total of 315 voters to date. The EIP voting hours are Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and after July 25, 2022, the hours will be expanding Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and specified hours on July 30, 2022, thru August 1, 2022.

The CCBOE has processed 27,500 Vote-by-Mail (VBM) ballot applications compared to the May 3, 2022, Primary when 35,000 VBM applications were received for the entire election cycle. The increase in ballot requests is attributed to the mailing of the VBM guide for the August 2, 2022, Primary Election. The CCBOE continues to educate the voters through press releases and social media of the August primary election.

The Election Support Department continues to prepare the equipment and supplies for the polling locations. Berman's Moving and Storage is scheduled for the first pick-up of equipment on July 14, 2022. The CCBOE did have nine location changes and the voters impacted by the changes have been notified.

Deputy Director Kaloger and Mike West, Community Outreach Manager, commented on an alleged case of voter fraud where a son voted on behalf of his deceased mother. The CCBOE staff will provide the Board with a report of their investigation on or before 8/31/22.


Deputy Director Kaloger stated the CCBOE staff will make a recommendation to the Board in August on the purchase of new voting equipment.

RELEASED: July 15, 2022

SUMMARY

- *Directive 2022-41* notifies the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) that the Ohio Secretary of State (SOS) will conduct a statewide mailing of absentee ballot applications for the Nov. 8, 2022 General Election.
- All new voter registrations and changes of address/name timely received by the July 5, 2022 voter registration deadline for the August 2, 2022 Primary Election must be entered into the voter registration database by **July 19, 2022**.
- The SOS will mail an absentee ballot application by non-forwardable mail to every registered Ohio voter in “active” or “confirmation” status.
- Initial applications are expected to be delivered during the first two weeks of September.
- The SOS will send a second absentee ballot application mailing in early October to include any individual who registers to vote or changes their name/address after the close of voter registration for the August 2, 2022 Primary Election.
- The CCBOE must post a copy of the statewide absentee ballot application mailing at each polling location as a reference for voters who are marked in the pollbook as having to cast a provisional ballot on account of having requested an absentee ballot.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW

The SOS will mail an absentee ballot application by non-forwardable mail to every registered Ohio voter in “active” or “confirmation” status. The absentee ballot application will be pre-filled with the voter’s name, current address, and local voter identification number and mailed to the voter’s address as it appears in the Statewide Voter Registration Database (SWVRD).

The United States Postal Service is expected to deliver the initial applications during the **first two weeks of September 2022**.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. PREPARATION FOR INITIAL MAILING

The CCBOE must do all the following **no later than July 19, 2022**:

- Enter all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices received and timely submitted or postmarked by the July 5, 2022 voter registration deadline for the August 2, 2022 Primary/Special Election and ensure that those new registrations and changes are transmitted to the SWVRD.
- Resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records.
- Review all alternate mailing addresses in the SWVRD (e.g., P.O. Boxes) and make sure that all alternate mailing addresses associated with a voter’s record in the SWVRD are current and

relevant to the elector's voter registration rather than some other election administration purpose.

II. PREPARATION FOR SUPPLEMENTAL MAILINGS

In early October 2022, the SOS will supplement the first mailing by sending an absentee ballot application to any individual who registers to vote or changes their name or address after the close of voter registration for the August 2, 2022 Primary/Special Election. To facilitate this mailing, the CCBOE must do all the following:

- **No later than October 5, 2022**, enter all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices and ensure that those new registrations and changes have been transmitted to the SWVRD.
- **No later than 5:00 p.m. on October 6, 2022**, resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records that exist.

The SOS will conduct a second supplemental mailing for any individual who registered to vote or changed their name or address between October 6 and October 11, 2022. To facilitate this mailing, the CCBOE must do all the following:

- **No later than October 13, 2022**, enter all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices, and ensure that those new registrations and changes have been transmitted to the SWVRD.
- **No later than 5:00 p.m. on October 14, 2022**, resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records that exist.

III. MANDATORY POSTING AT VOTING LOCATIONS ON ELECTION DAY

The CCBOE must post a copy of the statewide absentee ballot application mailing at each polling location only on Election Day as a reference for voters who are marked in the pollbook as having to cast a provisional ballot on account of having requested an absentee ballot.



DIRECTIVE 2022-41

July 15, 2022

To: All County Boards of Elections
Board Members, Directors, and Deputy Directors

Re: Preparation for the Statewide Mailings of Absentee Ballot Applications for the
November 8, 2022 General Election

SUMMARY

Since 2012, the General Assembly authorized the Secretary of State to send absentee ballot applications to all Ohio voters in gubernatorial and presidential general elections. This year, the Ohio Controlling Board authorized the Secretary of State's Office to use funds to conduct a statewide mailing of absentee ballot applications for the upcoming November 8, 2022 General Election.¹ This Directive requires each board of elections to update its voter registration database and resolve duplicate records in preparation for the Secretary of State's statewide mailing.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW

To ensure fairness and uniformity across counties, to reduce lines at polling places, and to make participation in the 2022 General Election as accessible as possible, the Secretary of State's Office will mail an absentee ballot application by non-forwardable mail to every registered Ohio voter in "active" or "confirmation" status.

The absentee ballot application will be pre-filled with the voter's name, current address, and local voter identification number (represented numerically and as a barcode) and mailed to the voter's address as it appears in the Statewide Voter Registration Database ("SWVRD"). To receive an absentee ballot, the voter must complete the absentee ballot application by providing the voter's date of birth, identification, and signature before sealing the application in the reply envelope and submitting it to the voter's county board of elections in person or by mail, with the voter affixing a first-class stamp.² The United States Postal Service is expected to deliver the initial applications during the first two weeks of September 2022.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. PREPARATION FOR INITIAL MAILING

To facilitate the initial mailing of absentee ballot applications, each county board of elections must do all of the following **no later than July 19, 2022**:

- Enter into the county voter registration database all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices received and timely submitted or postmarked by the July 5, 2022 voter registration deadline for the August 2, 2022 Primary/Special Election and ensure that those new registrations and changes are transmitted to the SWVRD. **Do not wait until July 19, 2022, to enter new voter registrations, changes of address or name, or information from returned confirmation notices.**
- Resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records. Remember, it is *never* an acceptable practice for any county board of elections to simply “keep” a voter registration record to avoid resolving duplicate records.
- Review all alternate mailing addresses in the SWVRD (*e.g.*, P.O. Boxes) for the county and make sure that all alternate mailing addresses associated with a voter’s record in the SWVRD are current and relevant to the elector’s voter registration rather than some other election administration purpose (*i.e.*, if the board has populated the elector’s alternate mailing address with the address for a previous election’s absentee ballot and that alternate mailing address was sent to the SWVRD as the elector’s alternate mailing address, that address should be removed since it is associated with absentee voting for a particular election).

II. PREPARATION FOR SUPPLEMENTAL MAILINGS

In early October 2022, the Secretary of State’s Office will supplement the first mailing by sending an absentee ballot application to any individual who registers to vote or changes their name or address after the close of voter registration for the August 2, 2022 Primary/Special Election. To facilitate this mailing, each board of elections must do all of the following:

- **No later than October 5, 2022**, enter into the county voter registration database all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices and ensure that those new registrations and changes have been transmitted to the SWVRD. **Do not wait until October 5, 2022 to enter new voter registrations, changes of address or name, or information from returned confirmation notices.**
- **No later than 5:00 p.m. on October 6, 2022**, resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records that exist.

The Secretary of State’s Office will conduct a second supplemental mailing for any individual who registered to vote or changed their name or address between October 6 and October 11, 2022. To facilitate this mailing, each board of elections must do all of the following:

- **No later than October 13, 2022**, enter into the county voter registration database all new voter registrations and changes of address or name, including information from returned confirmation notices, and ensure that those new registrations and changes have been transmitted to the SWVRD. **Do not wait until October 13, 2022 to enter new voter registrations, changes of address or name, or information from returned confirmation notices.**
- **No later than 5:00 p.m. on October 14, 2022**, resolve all in-county and cross-county duplicate records that exist.

III. MANDATORY POSTING AT VOTING LOCATIONS ON ELECTION DAY

All county boards of elections must post a copy of the statewide absentee ballot application mailing at each polling location **only** on Election Day as a reference for voters who are marked in the pollbook as having to cast a provisional ballot on account of having requested an absentee ballot. The prescribed posting will be provided to county boards of elections under separate cover at a later date.

RELEASED: July 22, 2022

SUMMARY

- *Directive 2022-42* provides instructions for implementing State Board of Education district boundaries designated by the Governor and certifying candidate petitions.
- Ohio law requires the districts for the 11 elected members of the State Board of Education to be composed of three contiguous state senate districts, updated every 10 years (following new census data).
- As the Ohio General Assembly did not establish new districts within the allocated period established by Ohio law, the Governor issued a Letter of Designation on January 31, 2022, designating the district boundaries.
- The SOS does not have the statutory authority to designate new State Board of Education districts.
- Petitions for candidates for the State Board of Education may not be reviewed for certification until the voter registration system is reprogrammed with the State Board of Education Districts.
- The filing deadline for Member of State Board of Education is August 10 at 4 p.m. (August 29 at 4 p.m. for write-in candidates).
- Members of the State Board of Education are nonpartisan.



DIRECTIVE 2022-42

July 22, 2022

To: All County Boards of Elections
Board Members, Directors, and Deputy Directors

Re: Designation of Districts for State Board of Education

SUMMARY

Ohio law requires the districts for the eleven elected members of the State Board of Education to be composed of three contiguous state senate districts and as such, every ten years these districts must be updated based upon “the most recent apportionment” of the General Assembly.¹ The law provides the General Assembly the first opportunity to establish the districts after that apportionment. Absent legislative action, the Governor has the authority to establish the new districts.² As the Ohio General Assembly did not establish new districts within the statute’s allocated period, the Governor issued a Letter of Designation on January 31, 2022, designating the district boundaries. Since the Governor’s Designation on January 31, 2022, neither the General Assembly nor the Governor have acted to create new State Board of Education districts based on legislative redistricting plans adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission after January 31. Therefore, the districts designated by the Governor on January 31, 2022 must serve as the new State Board of Education districts. The Secretary of State does not have the statutory authority to designate new State Board of Education districts.

This Directive provides instructions for implementing the State Board of Education district boundaries designated by the Governor and certifying candidate petitions for that office.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. DISTRICT BOUNDARIES FOR STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Governor DeWine designated districts for the State Board of Education districts based on the Senate districts map adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission on January 22, 2022. The district legal descriptions, equivalency files (also known as block assignment files), and most populous county/filing location lists accompany this Directive. Boards of elections must work with their vendor(s) to reprogram their voter registration systems and central tabulating system to reflect the State Board of Education districts designated by the Governor on January 31, 2022. Boards must complete reprogramming as soon as possible. Petitions for candidates for the State Board of Education may not be reviewed for certification until the county’s voter registration system is

reprogrammed with the State Board of Education Districts. Note that this Directive applies only to the State Board of Education; no other office or district boundary should change.³

II. CANDIDATE CERTIFICATION FOR STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION


Candidates seeking to appear on the ballot for the office of Member of State Board of Education must file nominating petitions with their district's most populous county no later than 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, **August 10, 2022**.⁴ Write-in candidates for Member of State Board of Education must file their declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, **August 29, 2022**.⁵ This is not a change from the original 2022 election calendar.

Each nominating petition for Member of State Board of Education must be signed by at least 100 qualified electors residing in the district designated on the petition, and each candidate must be a qualified elector residing in the district they seek to represent.⁶

Members of the State Board of Education are nonpartisan. Boards of elections must certify the validity and sufficiency of candidates' petitions in nonpartisan races no later than Monday, **August 22, 2022**.⁷ Protests against candidates for Member of State Board of Education must be filed with the most populous county board of elections in the district by Friday, **August 26, 2022**. If a protest is filed, the election officials with whom it is filed must promptly fix the time and place for a hearing.⁸

Each board of elections director must share this Directive with its legal counsel, the county prosecuting attorney, and its voter registration system and voting equipment vendors as soon as possible. 

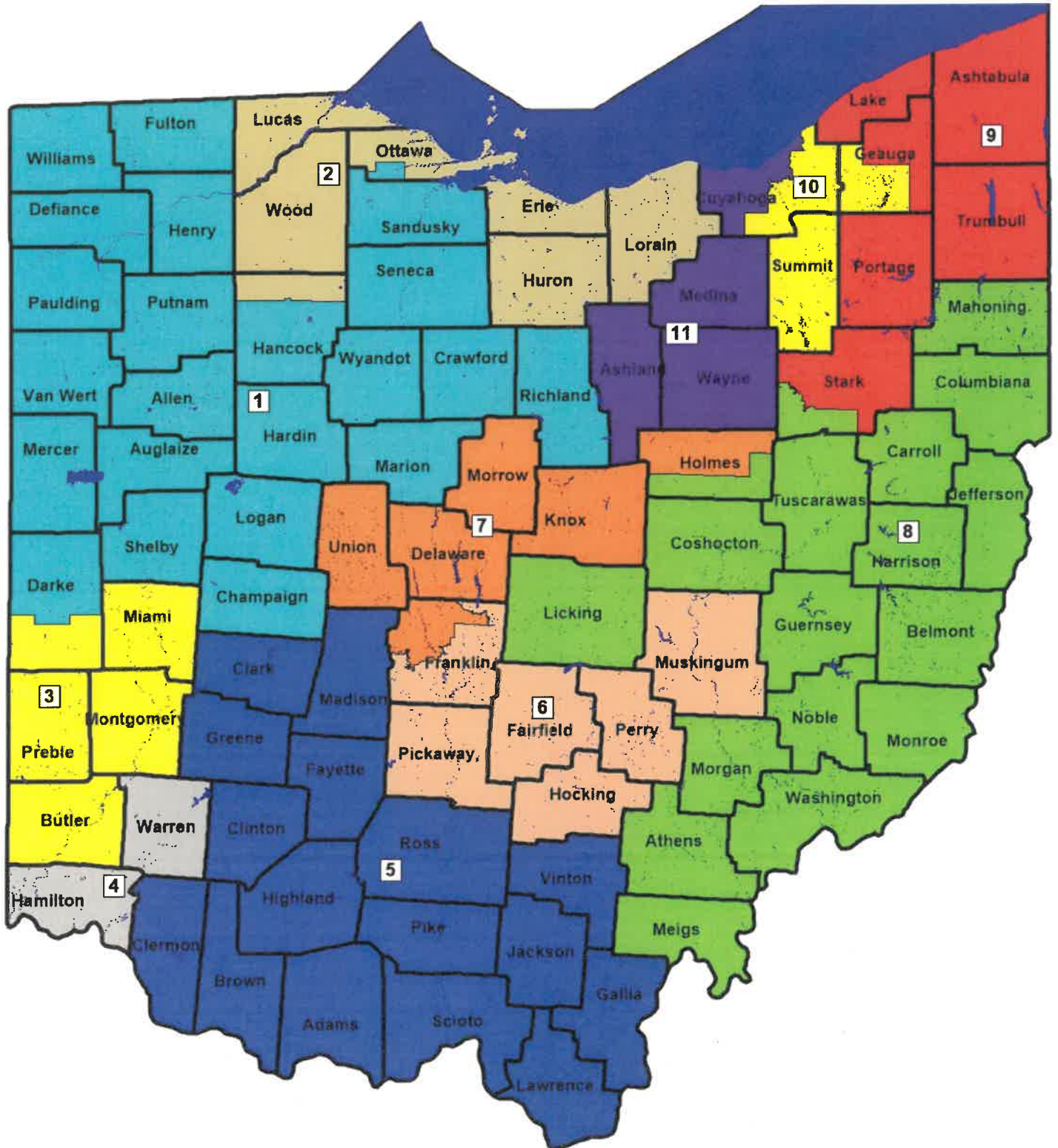

SUMMARY

- *Advisory 2022-03* alerts the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) to changes in the administration of elections resulting from the passage of House Bill 377 (H.B. 377).
- Specifically, “election workers” (which for the CCBOE would include poll workers and rovers) are excluded from PERS membership if they earn less than \$1,000 in a calendar year when there is more than one primary election. Previously, election workers were only exempt when paid less than \$600, regardless of the number of primary elections.
- H.B. 377 takes effect on September 27, 2022.

SUMMARY

Under continuing law, a person who is employed as an election worker and paid less than \$600 during a calendar year is not considered a public employee and is thus excluded from PERS membership. “Election worker” is defined by PERS administrative rule as “an individual who performs services as a precinct election official or voting location manager for the board of elections for a day the election polls are open and training or preparation for such service.”

H.B. 377 amends the law so that in calendar years when more than one primary election and one general election are held, election workers are not considered public employees if they are paid \$600 plus an amount not to exceed \$400 (up to \$1,000 total) for their service.

H.B. 377 takes effect on Sept. 27, 2022 and will be in effect for the Nov. 8, 2022 General Election. Therefore, precinct election officials who served in both the May 3, 2022 and August 2, 2022 primaries and the Nov. 8, 2022 General Election will be excluded from PERS membership, so long as they are not paid more than \$1,000 total for their service during the 2022 calendar year.

Re: House Bill 377 and Changes to Election Worker Exclusion from PERS

BACKGROUND

This advisory alerts boards of elections to changes in the administration of elections resulting from the passage of [House Bill 377](#) ("H.B. 377"). More specifically, H.B. 377 changes Ohio's law excluding certain election workers from the Public Employees Retirement System ("PERS"). The change in law takes effect on September 27, 2022. This bill, successfully advocated for by Secretary LaRose, builds upon the Secretary's efforts to boost poll worker recruitment by using innovative and commonsense solutions to incentivize civic participation.

SUMMARY

Under continuing law, a person who is employed as an election worker and paid less than \$600 during a calendar year is not considered a public employee and is thus excluded from PERS membership.¹ "Election worker" is defined by PERS administrative rule as "an individual who performs services as a precinct election official or voting location manager for the board of elections for a day the election polls are open and training or preparation for such service."² Note that the \$600 limit applies to compensation for service on Election Day *and* training. H.B. 377 amends the law so that in calendar years when more than one primary election and one general election are held, election workers are not considered public employees if they are paid \$600 plus an amount not to exceed \$400 (up to \$1,000 total) for their service.³

H.B. 377 takes effect on September 27, 2022 and will be in effect for the November 8, 2022 General Election. Therefore, precinct election officials who served in both the May 3, 2022 and August 2, 2022 primaries and the November 8, 2022 General Election will be excluded from PERS membership, so long as they are not paid more than \$1,000 total for their service during the 2022 calendar year.

Please share this Advisory with your legal counsel, the county prosecuting attorney, and the county auditor before the November 8, 2022 General Election. Boards should share this information publicly while recruiting precinct election officials. The change in law could enable PERS retirees to serve in all three elections this year without impacting their retirement benefits and access to health care. Summary of Lois and Robert Ellzey Voting Investigation

On or about July 8, 2022, WEWS reporter Jordan Vandenberg contacted the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) regarding allegations of a deceased voter casting ballots in elections during 2018 and 2020. The allegation specifically identified Lois Ellzey as the deceased voter based on information, Mr. Vandenberg obtained from the CCBOE's website and the Parma Heights and Brook Park Police Departments.

From media reports published on www.news5cleveland.com on July 15, 2022 and www.wkyc.com on July 12, 2022, the CCBOE learned Ms. Ellzey may have expired in 2012 per the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner and her skeletal remains were found in a storage unit in May 2022. The articles also indicate police found no record of Ms. Ellzey's death.

The media reports also state that Ms. Ellzey's son, Robert Ellzey was found dead inside his home in March 2022. Additionally, the police believe Mr. Ellzey may have been depositing his deceased mother's social security and retirement benefits into a bank account.

Upon being contacted by Mr. Vandenberg the CCBOE began researching the allegation regarding Ms. Ellzey. Staff found:

Voter Registration

- Lois and Robert Ellzey both have voter registrations affixed to 9793 Manorford Drive, Parma Heights, Ohio. Lois' registration is inactive, and Robert's is cancelled.
 - There are no other voters registered at the 9793 Manorford Drive address.
- Robert Ellzey registered at the 9793 Manorford Drive address July 2, 1971. His registration was cancelled pursuant to SOS requirements on June 2, 2022, after the CCBOE received notice of his death from the Ohio Department of Health.
- Lois Ellzey registered at the 9793 Manorford Drive address on August 29, 1972. Her registration cannot be canceled pursuant to SOS requirements until the CCBOE receives official notice of her death from the Ohio Department of Health.
 - She currently is marked in the voter registration database as "must vote provisional".
- Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office Property Records show that Lois Ellzey purchased the Parma Heights home in 1975 and is the current property owner of record.
 - The CCBOE could not find any additional voters being registered to the 9793 Manorford Drive address during the period Ms. Ellzey has been the property owner.

Voting History

- Since 2008, both Robert and Lois Ellzey have identical voter history records with all ballots cast in most Primary and General Elections via a Vote-by-Mail ballot. (see attached documents 2 and 9)
- The CCBOE does not have records of Robert and Lois Ellzey signing any petitions.

Vote-by-Mail

- CCBOE staff investigated the 2018 and 2020 voting materials for both Ellzey's that are chronologically associated with the Mr. Vandenberg's allegation.
 - Vote-by-Mail records prior to 2018 have been destroyed pursuant to the Secretary of State's Retention Policy.
- Robert Ellzey's 2018 and 2020 Vote-by-Mail Applications and 2020 Vote-by-Mail Identification Envelope include a date of birth, last 4 digits of his social security number and a signature that match his registration card of record submitted in 1971.
- Lois Ellzey's 2018 and 2020 Vote-by-Mail Applications and 2020 Vote-by-Mail Identification Envelope include a date of birth, last 4 digits of her social security number and a signature that reasonably matches her registration card of record submitted in 1972.
- Ballots for both Richard and Lois Ellzey were delivered to 9793 Manorford Drive, Parma Heights, OH 44130. No alternate mailing address was provided on any of their applications.

Conclusion and Recommendation.

Based on the information provided, the Board of Elections properly processed the Vote-by-Mail Applications and Vote-by-Mail Ballots received in 2018 and 2020 for Richard and Lois Ellzey. The identification information, date of birth and signatures on the Vote-by-Mail documents closely match the respective information on their respective registration cards. From media reports it appears that Mr. Ellzey may have been utilizing his mother's personal identification information to improperly deposit social security and retirement benefits into a bank account. The CCBOE believes he may have engaged in similar behavior to also cast ballots unlawfully in his mother's name. Pursuant to ORC 3501.11 the CCBOE has a duty to investigate this matter. The logical next step in the CCBOE's investigation is to speak to both Lois Ellzey and Robert Ellzey. Unfortunately, this opportunity has been abated by their respective deaths. The CCBOE has taken this review as far as it can.

In accordance with ORC 3501.11, the CCBOE Director and Deputy Director recommend forwarding this information to the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office and notifying the Secretary of State's Elections Counsel of this incident and corresponding referral. However, it appears that the voting irregularities and any Title 35 violations of the Revised Code inferable from Lois Ellzey's voting history during the 10 year period that her death was apparently concealed were abated by the death of Robert Ellzey.

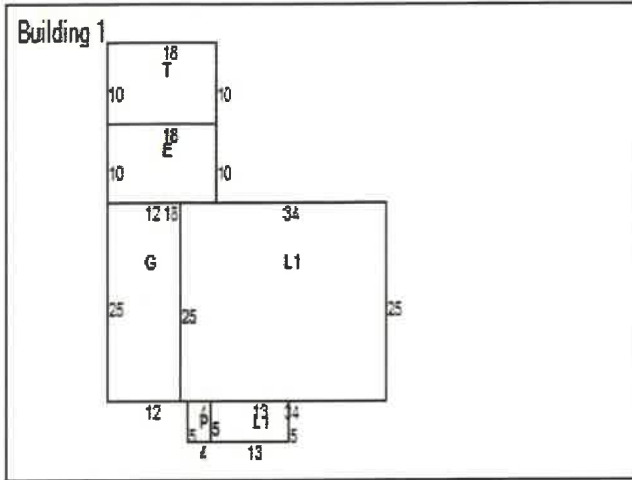

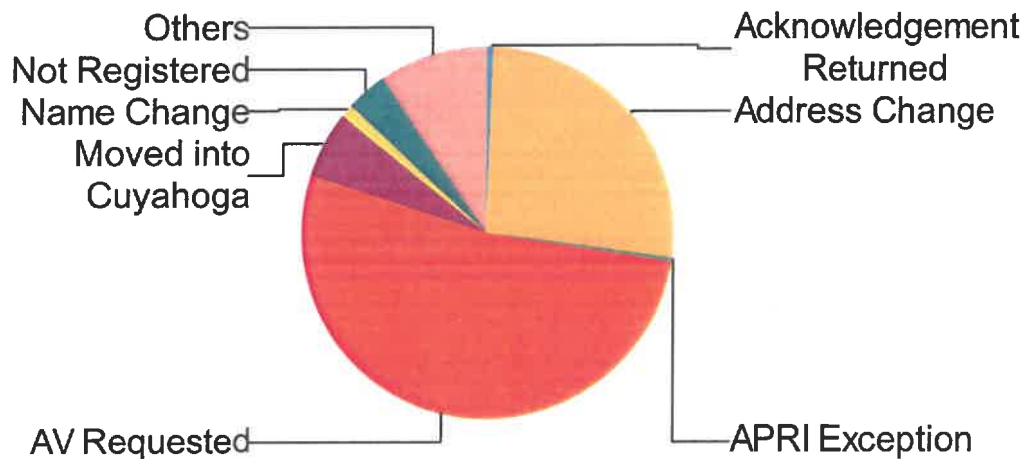

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-21

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY A TAX
OUTSIDE THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION
FOR ALL PURPOSES OF THE CLEVELAND – CUYAHOGA COUNTY PORT
AUTHORITY AT A RATE NOT EXCEEDING 0.13 MILL
AND REQUESTING THE COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER TO CERTIFY
THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED
BY SUCH TAX AND REPEALING AND RESCINDING
BOARD RESOLUTION NOS. 2022-13 AND 2022-18

WHEREAS, no part of the taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation imposed by Article XII, Section 2, of the Ohio Constitution are available to the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority; and

WHEREAS, Section 4582.14 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority to levy upon the property within its jurisdiction a tax, for all purposes, not in excess of one mill annually on the total value of all property as listed and assessed for taxation for any period not exceeding five years; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2017-27 adopted by the Board of Directors of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, and approved by a majority of the voters in an election held on November 7, 2017, a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the benefit of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority for all purposes of said Port Authority, in accordance with the provisions of 4582.14, Ohio Revised Code, at a rate not exceeding 0.13 mill for each dollar of valuation (the "Tax Levy"), was levied beginning with the duplicate for the year 2018 for distribution in year 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is now deemed necessary to request the electors to approve a renewal of the existing 0.13 mill Tax Levy for all purposes of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, including providing funds necessary for the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority's budget, for a period of five (5) years beginning with the tax duplicate of 2023; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the current total tax valuation of real property within the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a tax at the rate of 0.13 mill shall be requested from the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2022, the Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 2022-13 declaring the necessity to levy a tax outside the ten-mill limitation and requesting the County Fiscal Officer to certify the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by such tax (the "Resolution of Necessity") and on July 14, 2022 the Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 2022-18 authorizing the request for renewal of a 0.13 mill existing tax levy (the "Resolution to Proceed"); and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections has indicated that the Resolution of Necessity contained certain technical deficiencies that need to be corrected to place the levy on the

November 8, 2022 ballot and, therefore, the Board of Directors desires to repeal and rescind Resolution Nos. 2022-13 and 2022-18.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority Board of Directors, Cleveland, Ohio:

Section 1. That the amount of taxes which may be raised by the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio, within the ten-mill limitation imposed by Article XII, Section 2, of the Ohio Constitution will be insufficient to provide for the necessary requirements, including the budget of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, and that it is therefore necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation for all purposes of said Port Authority in an amount not to exceed thirteen hundredths (0.13) mill for each One Dollar of valuation, as a renewal of an existing tax levy, for five (5) years commencing on the 2023 tax duplicate, as authorized by section 4582.14 of the Revised Code.

Section 2. In accordance with section 5705.03(B)(1): (a) the purpose of the tax is to provide for the Port Authority's necessary requirements including the budget of the Port Authority; (b) the tax is a renewal of an existing tax; (c) Section 4582.14 of the Revised Code authorizes the Port Authority's submission of the question of the tax; (d) the term of the tax is for five (5) years; (e) the tax is to be levied upon the entire territory of the Port Authority; (f) the date of the election at which the question of the tax shall appear on the ballot is November 8, 2022; (g) the ballot measure shall be submitted to the entire territory of the Port Authority; (h) the tax year in which the tax will first be levied is 2023 and the calendar year in which the tax will first be collected is 2024; and (i) the Port Authority territory is Cuyahoga County.

Section 3. That this Board hereby finds and determines that the levying of the tax heretofore described would exceed the limitation provided by Article XII, Section 2, of the Ohio Constitution and that there is not available to said Port Authority any part of the taxes which may be raised within said limitation.

Section 4. That this Board hereby requests the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer to certify to this Board the total current tax valuation of real property within the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a tax levied at the rate of 0.13 mill, as a renewal of an existing tax.

Section 5. That the Secretary of the Board is directed immediately to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Fiscal Officer of Cuyahoga County, Ohio.

Section 6. That the Board hereby repeals and rescinds Resolution Nos. 2022-13 and 2022-18.

Section 7. That all formal actions of the Board of Directors of the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Board of Directors and that all deliberations of this Board of Directors that



Copy of one part petition was sent by the BOE to the Division of Liquor Control to determine the status of the liquor permit application stated on the petition.

Liquor Control responded back:

“Good afternoon! Broadview Brewing Company LLC is a holder of an AIA and AIC permit. NOTE: AIA and AIC permits will only give Sunday sales of beer if the ballot passes (currently they can't even sell beer on Sunday). If they want full Sunday privileges of wine/mixed bev/spirits that's indicated in the question wording they picked they need to apply for a D6. D6 is Sunday sales of wine/mixed bev/spirits. Please let me know if you have any questions.” (Exhibit B)

- Guide to Local Liquor Options Elections Page 17 & 18; (Exhibit G)
 - **R.C. 4301.333** mandates that each part of a **5-R** petition contain all of the following information: (Exhibit H)
 - #3: “The address and proposed use of the particular location within the election precinct to which the results of the question or questions specified in **R.C. 4301.355** apply. The law provides that, for purposes of this petition, “use” means all of the following:

The type of each liquor permit applied for by the applicant or held by the liquor permit holder as described in **R.C. 4303.11 to **4303.183**, including a description of the type of beer or intoxicating liquor sales authorized by each permit as provided in those sections (for example: C-2 liquor permit authorizing off-premise sales);**

- Owner Terry DeLap was called and was told of the above. CPS Manager Lawler indicated to Mr. DeLap that for the issue to be valid he would have needed to state on the petition in addition to holding the A1A & A1C permits, his company was also an “applicant for a D-6 liquor.” Mr. DeLap was also advised that the petition could not be altered after filing of the petition permit.

- Mr. DeLap indicated that he would apply for the D-6 and that the issue should be placed on the ballot. Mr. Lawler advised again the Board could not place the issue on the ballot because the “applicant for” language on the petition was missing. Mr. DeLap was further advised that persons signing this petition rely on the information stated and that not being an “applicant” was deceiving the petition signers. Also, the Board could not add the wording to the ballot language because ORC does not permit a petition to be altered after its filed with a public office. Mr. Lawler advised him of the option to withdraw the issue. Mr. DeLap said he needed time to think about this and would get back to Mr. Lawler the following day.
- Within 30 minutes of this conversation, Mr. DeLap called Mr. Lawler back and said he talked to Liquor Control and that he was going to withdraw the issue and to send him the form to complete. Mr. Lawler sent him the requested document.

8/10/2022

Janice DeLap, sent an email to Mr. Lawler that read in part “Please see attached file - this is proof that we have a D6 application on file. DO NOT WITHDRAWAL our petition.”

The attachment was a copy of the application status of Broadview Brewing Company now showing the company was an “applicant for a D-6” dated 8/8/22. (Exhibit C)

- At Ms. DeLap’s request Mr. Lawler called her to discuss this email.
- Ms. DeLap indicated to Mr. Lawler that she was on the phone with Liquor Control this morning and that Liquor Control took her application over the phone and back-dated the submission date to 8/8/22 (the day before the filing of the local option petition with the BOE).
- Mr. Lawler advised Ms. DeLap that although they are now an applicant for the D-6 permit, it does not change the fact the petition did not contain the required “applicant for” language that had to be present before collecting a voter’s signature.
- Ms. DeLap indicated that all they are trying to do is make a living and the issue has been resolved and should be placed on the ballot.
- Mr. Lawler advised her that he will discuss this with the Board’s legal counsel and let her know if the petition was acceptable for the ballot. Mr. Lawler confirmed verbally with Ms. DeLap of the Board meeting on Monday, August 15 at the main building 4th floor at 9:30 am.

Liquor Control sent an email to Mr. Lawler at 9:02 am indicating that the applicant reached out to them for a D-6 permit. But reiterated: “as her license currently stands she would get Sunday sales of BEER if the current question passed.” (Exhibit D)

Liquor Control sent an email to Mr. Lawler at 2:15 pm indicating D-6 permit was now on file. (Exhibit E)

Board legal counsel advised the petition is invalid for containing incomplete information. (Exhibit F)

8/11/2022 Petitioner was notified by email that Mr. Lawler is recommending to our Board that the Broadview Brewing Company's local option not be certified to the ballot, as well the Board meeting on August 15, 2022 at 9:30 am; 4th floor of the Board of Elections.

Note: all petitioners that receive local option petition packets from the BOE receive a copy of the Local Option handbook, as well as sign a form indicating they have received the necessary forms. (Exhibit I)

RECOMMENDATION: Petitioner's petitions do contain the complete ballot language, and therefore should not be certified to the November 8, 2022 General Election.

So they only hold an A1A and A1C permit, they circulated a petition saying they only hold A1A and A1C but were seeking beer/wine/liquor on Sundays, then backdated an D-6 application for Sunday beer/wine/liquor sales after submitting the petition?

If I understand the issue correctly, I would say they circulated a petition for electors to sign to allow an A1A/A1C holder to sell wine/liquor (in addition to beer) on Sundays. I think that is illegal on its face, and the petition is invalid. Even if they now (or back then) had the correct application on file, a petition cannot allow an A1A/A1C to sell wine/spiritous liquor on any day of the week.

What is missing are the words "applicant for a D-6 liquor permit". the attached hand book does not clearly define what needs to be on the petition, but my experience is that at a minimum you need to state applicant for if indeed you need this permit.

I advised the petitioner last night, and requested he withdraw the question. He said he would think about it. Called me back last night told me that he talked to Lic Control and that he was withdrawing the issue.

Today we get a "new" application status from the petitioner indicating that they are now an applicant.

The petitioner called be to discuss and informed me that Liq control took the application over the phone, and back dated the application to 8.8.22, the day before they filed with us. I told her that I think it is invalid, would confer with legal and it might be heard at the Board meeting on Monday.

Guide to Local Liquor Options Elections

Pages 16 - 19

Process for Particular Use at a Specific Location Local Liquor Option Election (Non-nuisance: Form 5-R)⁴⁹

Generally

This type of election authorizes the sale of three categories of alcoholic beverages at a specific location in an election precinct:

Category 1: Beer;

Category 2: Wine and mixed beverages; and

Category 3: Spirituous liquor.

Note: *“Wine and mixed beverages” is a single category, requiring BOTH wine and mixed beverages. Thus, petition may request “beer and wine and mixed beverages” or “wine and mixed beverages and spirituous liquor,” but NOT “beer and wine” or “beer and mixed beverages” or “mixed beverages and spirituous liquor.”*

The petition may request authorization to sell only one of the three categories, or any combination of the three, or all three categories of alcoholic beverages.

A petition for a particular use at a specific location can only be used by the following four entities:

1. Holder of the liquor permit(s) listed on the petition,
2. Applicant for the issuance or transfer of the liquor permit(s) for the location named in the petition,⁵⁰
3. Applicant who seeks to operate a liquor agency store, or
4. Designated agent of the holder or applicant for the liquor permit(s) for, or the operator of a liquor agency store at, the location named in the petition.

No one other than a holder or applicant for the necessary permit, operator of a liquor agency store, or the designated agent of the holder/applicant/operator may petition for a particular use election.

Petition Form; Petitioner Requirement

The procedure for particular use local liquor option elections differs significantly from other local liquor option elections. The petitioner, who must be a party legally associated with the premises named in the petition – i.e., the only premises to be affected by the election – files with the board of elections a valid and sufficient petition (**Form 5-R**), properly executed affidavit (**Form 5-N**), and, if the petitioner is the designated agent of a permit holder, applicant, or operator of a liquor agency store, written evidence of that designation.

Because only the location named in the petition will be affected by the election, there is no requirement that notice be given to the Division of Liquor Control or to any other permit holder who might be located within the precinct named in the petition before the petition is circulated.

Petitioners - Note well: *The name used on the petition to designate the permit holder, permit applicant, or operator of a liquor agency store – including, if applicable, any trade or fictitious name*

*under which it does, or intends to do, business – and the address of the location specified on the petition must be **identical** in all respects to the name and address then on file with the Division of Liquor Control for that location. If either the name or address on file with Liquor Control as of the date the board of elections certifies the validity and sufficiency of the petition is not identical to the petition, the question(s) will not be certified to the ballot. Ohio law specifically prohibits anyone from changing or withdrawing a petition after it has been filed.⁵¹*

The petitioner serves as the contact person for the local liquor option issue. Consequently, the petitioner must:

- Provide their name and mailing address to the board of elections, and
- Sign all documents to be filed with the board of elections that pertain to the local liquor option issue.

Pick up Petition and Other Materials

The **petitioner** – not the board of elections or any of its employees – determines which local liquor option question to place on the ballot. The petitioner is responsible for obtaining the appropriate petitions and other forms by a date far enough in advance of the targeted election to allow the petitioner sufficient time to meet all the statutory requirements, including the statutory filing deadline 90 days before the election.

The board of elections must provide the petitioner with the following materials:

1. **Petition (Form 5-R);**
2. **Form 5-N Affidavit of Intended Use;**
3. **Guide to Local Liquor Option Elections;** and
4. **Form 5-F, Certificate of Required Number of Signatures,** containing the minimum number of valid signatures required to place on the ballot the question(s) indicated on the petition. The board of elections must issue **Form 5-F** to the petitioner within 15 days after the petitioner's request. The petition (**Form 5-R**) must be signed by a number of qualified electors of the precinct that is equal in number to at least 35 percent of the total number of votes cast in that precinct for the office of governor at the most recent gubernatorial election, except that if the petition is solely for a Sunday sales question, the petition only needs the signatures of 50 qualified electors.

Note: A circulator of a local liquor option petition is not required to be an elector, but must be at least 18 years of age.

 **R.C. 4301.333** mandates that each part of a **5-R** petition contain all of the following information:

1. A notice that the petition is for the submission of the question or questions set forth in **R.C. 4301.355;**
2. The name of the applicant for the issuance or transfer, or the holder, of the liquor permit or, if applicable, the name of the liquor agency store, including any trade or fictitious names under which the applicant, holder, or liquor agency store either intends to do or does business at the particular location;

3. The address and proposed use of the particular location within the election precinct to which the results of the question or questions specified in R.C. 4301.355 apply. The law provides that, for purposes of this petition, "use" means **all** of the following:

- The **type of each liquor permit** applied for by the applicant or held by the liquor permit holder as described in R.C. 4303.11 to 4303.183, **including a description of the type of beer or intoxicating liquor sales authorized by each permit** as provided in those sections (for example: C-2 liquor permit authorizing off-premise sales);

Note: Failure to list the type of sales authorized by the permit on the petition will invalidate the petition. Some examples of the type of sales authorized include, but are not limited to, "on-premise sales," "off-premise sales," and "on/off premise sales," depending upon the type of liquor permit.

- If a **liquor agency store**, the fact that the business is operated as a liquor agency store authorized to operate by this state; and
- A **description of the general nature of the business** of the applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store (for example: convenience store).

File Petition

The petitioner must file all of the following documents with the board of elections not later than 4 p.m. on the 90th day before a general election or a special election held on a day on which a primary election may be held:

1. **Petition (Form 5-R).**

2. **Form 5-N Affidavit of Intended Use.**

3. If the permit holder/applicant or liquor agency store designated an agent for purpose of circulating and filing the 5-R petition, **separate written evidence of that designation of agent**, signed by the permit holder/ applicant or liquor agency store.

Note: There is no form prescribed by the Secretary of State for designating the agent. The parties who want the 5-R petition filed are responsible for producing the necessary documentation, such as a letter from the applicant identifying the agent as such.

4. **Appropriate filing fee.**⁵²

Note to Petitioners: The law requires you to file the affidavit (Form 5-N) and, if applicable, the written evidence of the designation of agent, at the time you file the petition (Form 5-R). Failure to comply will result in the invalidation of the entire petition.⁵³

Board of Elections Must Determine Petition's Validity and Sufficiency

Not later than the 78th day before the election, the board of elections must examine and determine the validity and sufficiency of the petition for certification of the question(s) to the ballot.⁵⁴

Board of Elections' Notice Requirements

Upon the filing of a 5-R Petition seeking an election on a particular use at a specific location, the board of elections may email a copy of the front side of one part of the petition to the Division of

Liquor Control at liquorlicensingmailunit@com.state.oh.us for verification prior to certification that the petitioner is an applicant, permit holder, or liquor agency store at the location specified on the petition.

The board of elections must submit the Notice of Election to be Held (**Form 126-A**) to the Secretary of State's office and the Division of Liquor Control upon the board's certification of the issue and determination of the date of the election.

Not later than 10 days before the election, the board of elections must post or publish a public notice of the election.⁵⁵

Special Instructions

Twenty-Nine Day Rule for Liquor Permit Holder Whose Permit is Made Partially or Wholly Unlawful Due to Results of Certain Local Liquor Option Elections

Where a permit is made partially unlawful as the result of a local liquor option election held pursuant to:

- R.C. 4301.35 (choice of questions);
- R.C. 4301.351 (Sunday sales in entire precinct);
- R.C. 4301.353 (sales in a portion of a precinct);
- R.C. 4303.29 (sale of spirituous liquor by the glass); or
- R.C. 4305.14 (sale of beer).

A particular location local liquor option election may be held if both of the following occur no later than 29 days after the Division of Liquor Control receives the final notice of the results of such election:

1. The affected permit holder files with the board of elections a valid and sufficient petition for a particular use at a specific location (**Form 5-R**) to hold a particular location local liquor option election pursuant to R.C. 4301.333; and
2. The affected permit holder files with the Division of Liquor Control's superintendent a copy of that petition (**Form 5-R**) bearing the board of elections' file stamp.

If both of those conditions are met, the results of the local liquor option election that made the permit partially unlawful will not take effect as to that liquor permit holder until the Division of Liquor Control receives final notice from the board of elections of either of the following events (whichever occurs earlier):

1. The board of elections determines that the petition (**Form 5-R**) filed by the permit holder pursuant to R.C. 4301.39 (G) is invalid; or
2. An election held pursuant to R.C. 4301.355 concerning the liquor permit holder resulted in a majority no vote.

Ohio Revised Code

Section 4301.333 Local option petition contesting a particular location.

Effective: March 23, 2022

Legislation: Senate Bill 102

(A) The privilege of local option conferred by section 4301.323 of the Revised Code may be exercised if, not later than four p.m. of the ninetieth day before the day of a general election or a special election held on a day on which a primary election may be held, a petition is presented to the board of elections of the county in which the precinct is situated by a petitioner who is one of the following:

(1) An applicant for the issuance or transfer of a liquor permit at, or to, a particular location within the precinct;

(2) The holder of a liquor permit at a particular location within the precinct;

(3) A person who operates or seeks to operate a liquor agency store at a particular location within the precinct;

(4) The designated agent for an applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store described in division (A)(1), (2), or (3) of this section.

(B) If the petition is for the submission of the question specified in division (B)(1) of section 4301.355 of the Revised Code or both questions specified in divisions (B)(1) and (2) of that section, the petition shall be signed by the electors of the precinct equal in number to at least thirty-five per cent of the total number of votes cast in the precinct for the office of governor at the preceding general election for that office. If the petition is solely for the submission of the question specified in division (B)(2) of section 4301.355 of the Revised Code, the petition shall be signed by fifty electors.

The petition shall contain all of the following:

(1) A notice that the petition is for the submission of the question or questions set forth in section 4301.355 of the Revised Code;



(2) The name of the applicant for the issuance or transfer, or the holder, of the liquor permit or, if applicable, the name of the liquor agency store, including any trade or fictitious names under which the applicant, holder, or liquor agency store either intends to do or does business at the particular location;

(3) The address and proposed use of the particular location within the election precinct to which the results of the question or questions specified in section 4301.355 of the Revised Code shall apply. For purposes of this division, "use" means all of the following:

(a) The type of each liquor permit applied for by the applicant or held by the liquor permit holder as described in sections 4303.11 to 4303.183 of the Revised Code, including a description of the type of beer or intoxicating liquor sales authorized by each permit as provided in those sections;

(b) If a liquor agency store, the fact that the business operated as a liquor agency store authorized to operate by this state;

(c) A description of the general nature of the business of the applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store.

(C)(1) At the time the petitioner files the petition with the board of elections, the petitioner shall provide to the board both of the following:

(a) An affidavit that is signed by the petitioner and that states the proposed use of the location following the election held to authorize the sale of beer or intoxicating liquor authorized by each permit as provided in sections 4303.11 to 4303.183 of the Revised Code;

(b) Written evidence of the designation of an agent by the applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store described in division (A)(1), (2), or (3) of this section for the purpose of petitioning for the local option election, if the petitioner is the designated agent of the applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store.

(2) Failure to supply the affidavit, or the written evidence of the designation of the agent if the



petitioner for the local option election is the agent of the applicant, liquor permit holder, or liquor agency store described in division (A)(1), (2), or (3) of this section, at the time the petition is filed invalidates the entire petition.

(D) Not later than the seventy-eighth day before the day of the next general election or the next special election held on a day on which a primary election may be held, whichever occurs first, the board shall examine and determine the sufficiency of the signatures and the validity of the petition. If the board finds that the petition contains sufficient signatures and in other respects is valid, it shall order the holding of an election in the precinct on the day of the next general election or the next special election held on a day on which a primary election may be held, whichever occurs first, for the submission of the question or questions set forth in section 4301.355 of the Revised Code.

(E) A petition filed with the board of elections under this section shall be open to public inspection under rules adopted by the board.

(F) An elector who is eligible to vote on the question or questions set forth in section 4301.355 of the Revised Code may file, not later than four p.m. of the seventy-fourth day before the day of the election at which the question or questions will be submitted to the electors, a protest against a local option petition circulated and filed pursuant to this section. The protest shall be in writing and shall be filed with the election officials with whom the petition was filed. Upon the filing of the protest, the election officials with whom it is filed shall promptly establish a time and place for hearing the protest and shall mail notice of the time and place for the hearing to the applicant for, or the holder of, the liquor permit who is specified in the petition and to the elector who filed the protest. At the time and place established in the notice, the election officials shall hear the protest and determine the validity of the petition.

**FIRST AMENDMENT

This First Amendment to the Contract ("Amendment") is entered into this 2nd day of August, 2022 ("Execution Date") by and between CUYAHOGA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS (the "Board") and Clerac, LLC dba Enterprise Rent-A-Car (the "Vendor"), through its duly authorized officer.

Recitals

- A. The Board and Contractor, entered into the contract, dated March 12, 2021, for the rental of various cargo and minivans through May 5, 2023 with options to renew by mutual agreement between the Board and the Vendor for any amount of time and for any number of periods.
- B. The Contract contained a not-to-exceed amount of \$198,396.00 based on the estimated quantities of vans necessary to fulfill the Board's requirements for all elections occurring during the initial term, but provided that the Contractor will furnish the Board's additional requirements for any other elections that arise during the term under the same specifications, requirements and terms of the Contract.
- C. The Board has identified additional requirements for the rental of cargo and minivans beyond its revised estimated quantities due to a special election occurring on August 2, 2022.
- D. The Board and the Vendor desire to amend the Contract to increase the not-to-exceed amount of the rental of cargo and minivans to fulfill the Board's newly revised estimated requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein and after good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as set forth below:

1. **MODIFICATION TO CONTRACT FEE.**

For the purpose of increasing the Contract's not-to-exceed amount from \$198,396.00 to \$227,650.50 as necessary to compensate the Contractor for the revised estimated requirements,

existing Section A. of Article 1. AMOUNT of the Contract is deleted and restated in its entirety as follows:


A. **Amount.** The total amount paid by the Board to the Vendor pursuant to this Contract shall **not exceed \$227,650.50**. The Board shall pay the Vendor based on periodic verified invoices that are undisputed and contain supporting documentation for actual rental categories and quantities and the corresponding amounts set forth in Bid. If the invoice is not acceptable, the Board shall inform the Vendor of the reasons and the corrective actions necessary, if any, to qualify the billing for approval.

2. INCORPORATION.

Effective on the Execution Date, the provisions of this First Amendment are incorporated into the original Contract, as if fully rewritten in the Contract. All terms used in this First Amendment shall be defined and construed in the manner set forth in the original Agreement. Except as otherwise provided herein, or as otherwise necessary or appropriate to give effect to the terms of this First Amendment, all the provisions, terms, and conditions contained in the Contract and not inconsistent with this First Amendment shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict between the original Contract and this First Amendment, the terms, the conditions, and provisions of this Amendment shall control.

Under letter agreements dated February 14, 2022 and April 6, 2022, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections ("Board") and Berman Moving and Storage, Inc. ("Berman") exercised two options to renew the contract for the Delivery and Return of Voting Equipment for all Elections in Cuyahoga County, based on Bid #2021.03.22, ("Contract"). The first option to renew exercised under the letter dated February 14, 2022 carried a term from May 3, 2022 through November 2, 2022. The second renewal period, executed through the letter dated April 6, 2022, extends from November 2, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

Under the Contract, Berman promised to furnish the Board's requirements for the transportation and storage of voting equipment throughout the initial and any renewal term. PETITION PROTOCOLS

Candidate and Petition Services

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Petition Criteria

Prior to circulating petitions, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) will provide candidates who pull petitions from the CCBOE with general information regarding what needs to appear on petitions as well as information about the process of filing. Additionally, candidates are directed to review the Secretary of State’s (SOS) free publications, especially the [Ohio Candidate Requirement Guide](#).

It is critical that candidates review the municipal charter for the jurisdictions they are seeking prior to circulating petitions. Not every municipality has the same petition criteria. The Law Department for each municipality is the subject matter expert for their municipality’s charter.

If duplicate signatures are received in municipalities with elector signature limitations, the official petition filing timestamp is utilized to rank the order of petitions received. This timestamp and not the date the elector signed the petition will be reviewed to process duplicate signatures on multiple candidate petition filings.

No Petition Pre-Checks

Pursuant to SOS Directive¹, no board of elections shall pre-check any petition to determine the petition’s validity and sufficiency before such time as the original petition has been filed, along with the appropriate filing fee, with a board of elections, the SOS Office, or other public office as provided by law.

While pre-checks may appear to be a public service that potential candidates might rely on to improve their chances of being certified to the ballot pre-checks provide a false sense of security for candidates and issue groups. It is a well-established principle of Ohio election law that the candidate is solely responsible for ensuring that his or her own petition satisfies the requirements of law. Candidates and issue groups are obligated to investigate, learn, and know the law governing the election process.

Official Time and Location of Filing

The CCBOE accepts petition filings at its offices at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44115. To be considered as timely filed, candidates must obtain an official CCBOE timestamp no later than 4:00 p.m. on the date of the filing deadline. The timestamp clock(s) located in the CCBOE's Candidate and Petition Services Department holds the official time for petition filings.

Simply being on the Board's property (e.g., CCBOE parking lot) prior to the time of the filing deadline does not constitute a timely filing. Candidates' petitions must contain an official timestamp on or before the time of the filing deadline to be considered timely filed.

Petition filings will be accepted through mail/delivery service; however, the petition must arrive at the CCBOE offices by 4:00 p.m. on the date of the filing deadline with the applicable filing fee. A postmark is not a timestamp for the purpose of determining if a petition is timely filed. Any petition received via mail/delivery service without the applicable filing fee is considered an incomplete petition filing.

No petition filed *in person* shall be timestamped or accepted for filing after 4:00 p.m. on the date of the filing deadline.
