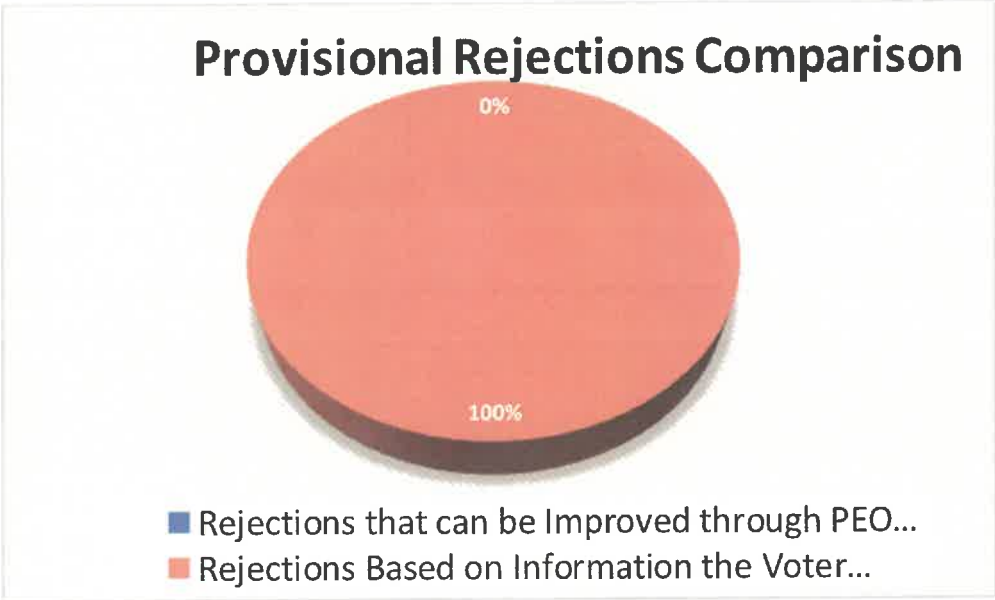

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Meeting began at 9:30 a.m. Hereinafter referred to as the CCBOE/Board.

Chairman Curtis noted that all Board Members were in attendance.

Agenda Item 1: Approval of the minutes from the November 6, 2023, board meeting

Chairman Curtis moved to approve the minutes from the November 6, 2023, board meeting. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 2: Acknowledgment of Secretary of State Directive 2023-20: General Assembly District Maps

Chairman Curtis moved to acknowledge Secretary of State Directive 2023-20: General Assembly District Maps. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 3: Determination of the validity of provisional ballots and authorization to count provisional ballots from the November 7, 2023, General Election

Hasani Wheat, Registration Department Manager, presented the November 7, 2023, General Election Provisional Report to the Board, as provided in the meeting materials.

Chairman Curtis moved to approve the determination of the validity of provisional ballots and authorization to count provisional ballots from the November 7, 2023, General Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The Board discussed two cases where voters cast two ballots in the November 7, 2023, General Election. In both cases, the voters cast provisional ballots, which were part of the rejected ballots total. The first voter had cast a ballot on Election Day at the polls and had voter remorse. The polling

location would not issue the voter another ballot. The voter then came to the CCBOE and demanded to vote another ballot. After CCBOE staff explained the provisional would not count, the voter remained adamant to vote again and was issued a provisional ballot, which the voter completed and submitted.

The second case was a voter who cast and returned an absentee ballot in October 2023 in Ottawa County, where the voter was registered. The voter subsequently moved to Cuyahoga County and came to the CCBOE for Early In-Person voting on November 1, 2023. The CCBOE issued the voter a provisional ballot to the address he had recently moved. Through the provisional verification process, the voter was found to be registered in Ottawa County and voted by mail in that county. Therefore, the CCBOE rejected the provisional ballot.

Chairman Curtis stated the two provisional ballots were rejected and will remain sealed. Board Member Stickan made a motion to refer both voters to the Secretary of State Public Integrity Division. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The Board discussed the two matters and determined further investigation is needed before a determination is made to refer the voters to the Secretary of State (SOS) Public Integrity Division. Board Member Stickan stated that knowing the Board would further discuss these two matters at the November 28th board meeting, she withdrew the motion Director Perlatti said with November 23rd and 24th, 2023, being the Thanksgiving holiday, the Board Meeting on December 18, 2023, would be a better date for discussion.

Agenda Item 4: Acknowledgment of intent to retire from elected office

Chairman Curtis moved to acknowledge the intent to retire from elected office, as set forth in the board materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

November 7, 2023, General Election Update

Director Perlatti read the following statement regarding the November 7, 2023, General Election. “The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections conducted a successful November 7, 2023, General Election, with the efforts of those who served as poll workers. As can be expected in any election, there were unforeseen challenges staff encountered on election day. Staff and the poll workers put forth their best efforts to navigate through these encounters. On election day and up to this point in time staff learn more about the experiences poll workers and voters experienced on election day and use this knowledge in preparation of the official certification. Bay Presbyterian Church served as a polling location on election day. There were four precincts assigned to this location with three ballot scanners allocated to the location. These three scanners were utilized throughout the day for voters to cast ballots. After the close of polls, the poll workers engaged in the ballot scanner processes to shut down these machines. Two of the three machines shut down without incident. The third machine seems to have had a software freeze at some point near the end of the shutdown process, and did not fully cycle through the shutdown process. The machine results report also did not print correctly, it seems the paper roll became jammed and would not advance. The poll workers remembered their training to not leave the memory devices in the ballot scanners, and placed all three memory sticks in the correct transport case for delivery back to the board offices. The poll workers did make a simple notation that they had problems with closing one of the memory sticks. Upon receiving the memory sticks and physical paper ballots on election night at the board offices, staff were unsure if the memory stick in question would correctly tabulate the ballot scans from the respective machine. Following established board procedures, staff scanned what they believed to be the ballots from all three scanners from Bay Presbyterian Church and uploaded those results on election night for use in the unofficial election results. It was found in the days following election day during the Board’s post-election ballot audit that not all the Bay Presbyterian Church poll location ballots were

scanned on election night. This was found through a comparison of the number of electronic pollbook (EPB) signature check-ins from the location, the unofficial results, and the number of pages counted during the post-election ballot audit scan. Upon finding out this information, staff sent an email to the contested candidates impacted by this finding to make them aware that additional ballots will be included in the official results for their contests. Since election night, at no time has the Board of Elections not been in custody of all the ballots and memory sticks from the Bay Presbyterian Church polling location. It is the Board's regular operating procedures to scan the paper ballots from election day if there is, or appears to be, a problem with a ballot scanner on election day. It is also the Board's regular operating procedures to conduct a post-election audit scan on as many polling locations as time allows during the official certification process. Absolutely nothing nefarious transpired during this process and the Board's staff and poll workers conducted their duties with integrity. There are no internal bad actors in this matter. Further, the board was and continues to be transparent with the impacted candidates from the onset of identifying this issue. Staff answered questions of the candidates or their representatives during last week's public test of the automatic tabulating equipment to what we believe to be their satisfaction. The unofficial results are just that, unofficial, and serve as preliminary results for the election. By statutory design there is a multiple weeks long period of time for Boards of Elections to conduct their post-election duties, and have all items in place for the official certification of results. Per Ohio election law, no intermediate election results can be published between the unofficial election results and the official election results. Official certification of the November 7th General Election will occur on November 28th with all ballots from the Bay Presbyterian Church poll location included in addition to valid provisional ballots and valid post-election ballots. Also on election day, there were a few of the 289 polling locations that exceeded election day turnout predictions and needed additional ballots. These poll locations were primarily located in Lakewood, Walton Hills, and Valley View. To create the November 7, 2023 ballot order, staff looked to the election day turnout in the August 2023 Special Election and November 2022 Gubernatorial General Election. Whichever turnout was larger on a per precinct basis, 105% of that number was ordered, plus an additional 25 ballots per precinct, and 115% of the number of provisional ballots cast. This formula was sufficient for 97-98% of the precincts in the election. In the 2-3% of precincts where it was not sufficient, these locations were voting at near presidential year turnout levels. And in cities such as Lakewood, the ballot matter was not uniform across the city with about half of the polling locations being impacted with higher turnout. Throughout the day staff monitored election turnout and identified that some precincts were turning out higher than expected. At approximately 1:30pm an order for additional ballots for select locations was placed with Midwest Direct. These order determinations were primarily made looking at the morning turnout. Staff expected this ballot order to make it out into the field around 5:00 pm. Around 5:00pm I was informed by Midwest that the supplemental ballot orders were delayed in getting out into the field and were being dispersed as quickly as possible on a rolling basis as printing completed. A little before 6:00pm Board staff began to print supplemental ballots at the board's office and prepare them for delivery into the field. Board staff were dispatched into the field to deliver either preprinted supplemental ballots and/or blank ballot stock for use in the ADA voting machine which is also a ballot on demand printer. While the supplemental ballots and ballot stock were being printed and transported, staff spoke with poll workers teaching them how to print ballots on demand from the ADA machine if needed and until supplemental ballots arrived. Staff instructed poll workers to not send anyone away from the polling locations while the on-demand ballots were being printed and until supplemental resources could be delivered. The poll workers did an excellent job during this challenging situation. Staff have already met to discuss improvements to the supplemental ballot printing process. We are trying to determine a more efficient way to monitor ballot usage and will be proactively training voting location managers on the ballot on demand process. When ordering election day ballots, staff are balancing not overloading the ballot bags so they weigh more than 40 pounds, logistically can be delivered to and from the polling locations with reasonable effort, and be cognizant of tax dollars spent on these materials that are stored

between 3 to 22 months post-election. The board staff will be taking the necessary steps to ensure that 100% of poll locations have the ballots they need to execute an election.”

Board Member Davis Chappell asked if other polling locations reported the same software issue. Board Member Stickan asked if the incident was a machine or user issue. Director Perlatti stated the machine did not shut down correctly. The machine did not get to the point where it told the poll workers to unmount the stick. The poll workers eventually pulled the stick out and returned it to the CCBOE with a note. The Clear Ballot technicians were on site, and they were not familiar with any unmounting issues. The CCBOE has over 700 scanners in the field, and this is the only scanner that came to the CCBOE’s attention. The CCBOE will send Clear Ballot the stick to analyze the encrypted information and see precisely what happened with the shutdown process. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if any other scanners had that issue. Director Perlatti stated no. Board Member McCafferty said if there were issues, the polling location would not have been able to balance how many voters came through, how many ballots were issued, soiled, etc. Director Perlatti explained the processes between the unofficial and official results. Board Member Stickan asked if the updated Bay Village results could be published. Director Perlatti stated the SOS Directive states there can not be any partial or intermittent results reported between the unofficial results and official results. The Board discussed the internal processes for the initial ballot orders, printing election day ballots in-house and at the polling locations for the 2024 Presidential elections. Director Perlatti stated the CCBOE is already working with Clear Ballot regarding election night reports that will help the CCBOE do checks and balances, similar to the reporting features available through the previous vendor ES&S. Those reporting features will be available for the March Presidential Primary. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if there were any disenfranchised voters. Director Perlatti said no. Polling locations were told not to turn anyone away, and the locations were telling voters to pause and wait. Poll workers did a great job relaying that information to voters. Board Member Davis Chappell asked how long it takes to print the ballots from the ADA ballot on-demand printer. Director Perlatti stated it takes one minute to print a two-page ballot. Deputy Director Kaloger said further poll worker training will be done, and a quick reference guide will be provided regarding the ballot on demand for the 2024 elections. Director Perlatti will report back to the Board regarding an upcoming meeting with Midwest Direct, the print vendor, regarding the delay in providing the election day ballots to the locations and better communications if there is a reason for any delays. Director Perlatti stated the CCBOE finished uploading the results later than usual, not due to any problems, but because now the CCBOE takes images of the scanned ballots. Due to the high voter turnout, the CCBOE uploaded 40 to 120 memory sticks every half an hour, totaling almost one million images. Board Member Davis Chappell asked when saving the images became an issue. Director Perlatti stated it is a new 2023 Directive, and the CCBOE did not need to save images with the ES&S equipment other than write-in images. Director Perlatti has spoken with the SOS Director of Elections regarding pushing the vendors to see what can be done to increase the speed of data uploading. In conversations between the CCBOE and Clear Ballot, there is a way to upload the numeric results first and then go back and upload the images separately. The CCBOE and Clear Ballot will work on this process in a test environment. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the changes would need to go through the Ohio Board of Voting Machine Examiners. Director Perlatti said what he explained currently exists, so a certification change would not be needed. The CCBOE will work on uploading the results, reporting the results, and then going back to upload images. Board Member Davis Chappell asked about the rationale for the new requirement to upload the images since the CCBOE has a verified voter paper trail, which is the evidence. Board Member Stickan asked if this is the first time with the new Directive did the CCBOE have a discussion with Clear Ballot before and if the CCBOE anticipated it would take so long to upload the images. The CCBOE needs to get ahead of any new changes in a directive. Board Member Davis Chappell asked if the CCBOE could get a waiver as large counties will not be able to report the results in a timely manner. Assistant Prosecutor Musson stated the change in the state law requires boards of elections to retain the images for as long as the paper ballots are retained. He said

the changes were part of the Budget Bill and would not take effect until 2025. However, the Directive is making counties implement it sooner. Director Perlatti said the CCBOE has notified the SOS that something will need to be done for the 2024 elections. The CCBOE could request an extension in reporting the write-in candidates. Board Member Stickan asked if there were any changes to the Ohio Revised Code that will be applicable for 2024 that could be impactful. Director Perlatti said that with every statutory election, the SOS will issue a temporary directive specific to that election. There will be a directive for the unofficial and official canvas directive. A directive will be issued for the March 2024 primary. The Election Official Manual is a permanent directive. That book is outdated and has not been updated to capture any changes in the laws. There are different windows of time in which the SOS can update it. There will probably not be an update to the manual until Summer 2024. Additional temporary directives will likely be issued to address some of the changes to the law. He explained that changes to House Bill 458 are not in the Election Official Manual. Director Perlatti stated the Election Officials Department submitted the poll worker payroll to the County payroll office for an Ohio Public Employees Retirement System review. Then, the payroll file will be passed onto the County Accounts Payable Department. The CCBOE should be able to mail the checks on Tuesday, November 28, 2023. The CCBOE has received 1,904 post-election absentee ballots, and 1,264 were eligible to be counted. Bermans Moving and Storage is completing equipment pick-up today. Bermans provided the CCBOE with excellent service and met every deadline this election. With the unofficial results, not including the provisionals or post-election absentees as of November 20, 2023, there are currently three contests that would qualify for an automatic recount. Any additional recounts will be determined when the Official Certification is completed.

December 5, 2023, East Cleveland Recall Election

Deputy Director Kaloger stated the December 5, 2023, East Cleveland Recall Election is in 18 days. Early In-Person (EIP) voting began on November 7, 2023, and 27 voters have voted at the CCBOE. Thursday, November 23, 2023, is Thanksgiving, and the CCBOE is closed. However, State law requires the CCBOE to be open on Friday, November 24, 2023, for EIP voting. There will be two staff members, one Democrat and one Republican, and security will also be in the building. The CCBOE has processed 18 vote-by-mail ballot applications, and two ballots have been returned. On Election Day, there will be 15 precincts in five polling locations, which CCBOE employees and several poll workers will staff. The CCBOE will be using the new electronic poll books for this election. The Election Support Department will deliver the voting equipment to the five locations. There will be a Monday Night Organizational meeting.

Update on end-of-year projects

Director Perlatti stated there are projects the CCBOE staff are working on in addition to certifying the November 7, 2023, General Election and the upcoming December 5, 2023, East Cleveland Recall Election. The General Assembly Redistricting is Directive 2023-20 for the new State House and Senate District boundaries. By the week of December 4, 2023, the CCBOE should be able to post the Cuyahoga County map on the website. Of the eleven districts in Cuyahoga County, nine districts include a part of Cleveland. The CCBOEs' goal is to have all the proofing and DIMS work entered by December 11, 2023. The SOS deadline is December 20, 2023, which is also the deadline for candidates to file petitions for the offices. Once the DIMS work is completed, the petitions can be verified. The Election Administration Plan is being finalized and will be sent to Assist Prosecutor Musson next week for redaction purposes. The Plan will be sent to the Board for review by December 8, 2023. The Board does not need to take action on the Plan but will need to sign it. The SOS updated the retention schedule. The CCBOE will need to present the retention schedule to the County Archives, and a board will then approve it on December 5, 2023. The SOS retention schedule is then incorporated and accepted by Cuyahoga County. The CCBOE is receiving shipments of EPB materials. Peter James, Election Compliance Administration, is working with County IT to donate the existing EPBs to the Cleveland Metropolitan School District. The Fiscal Department is

also working with County IT to convert the old poll books to new ones for a smooth inventory transition. The goal is to have all the new equipment acceptance tested, labeled, inventoried and ready to enter into the preparation for the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary. The Election Official Department is working on poll worker training updates. The management team will be meeting this week to review what needs to be incorporated into poll worker training, and by December 8, 2023, the changes need to be locked in for the quick reference guides and training manuals and go to print. Poll worker training starts on January 19, 2024. The deadline to file candidate petitions is December 20, 2023, and certification of candidates will take place on January 2, 2024.

Alleged Double Voters

Cynthia Renee Barron

- On Election Day (November 7, 2023) Ms. Barron went to her polling location and cast a regular ballot through the scanner. After casting her ballot, she realized she made a mistake and wanted to vote differently. The poll workers correctly informed her she could **not** obtain another ballot since her ballot had been fully processed.
- On November 20th, the Board voted not to count Ms. Barron's provisional ballot and to gather additional information from staff.
- Staff reported that the voter appeared at the BOE complaining that she mismarked her ballot and was denied the opportunity by the poll workers to re-cast her ballot at the polling location. Staff reported that they explained to Ms. Barron that the poll workers had correctly advised her that a second ballot could not be issued since the first ballot had been counted. The voter demanded to cast a second ballot for the selections she wanted to vote on. She did not want to accept the fact that she made an error. They reported that the encounter did not last more than a few minutes.
- The Secretary of State's training on de-escalation advises against rushing to involve law enforcement and to only call them if the election official feels their safety and the safety of others is in jeopardy. Staff determined the best path to de-escalation was to allow the voter to cast a provisional ballot knowing that Ms. Barron's election day ballot had been counted and the provisional ballot would therefore be rejected.

Timothy George Jacobs

- Mr. Jacobs had been a regular voter in Ottawa County since 2020. He cast an absentee ballot in Ottawa County on October 20, 2023. On November 1, 2023, he cast a provisional ballot in Cuyahoga County during Early In-Person voting and changed his registered address to Cuyahoga County.
- During the Cuyahoga County provisional verification process the Ottawa County BOE informed us that his absentee ballot had been counted. We were unable to identify a valid phone number or email address for Mr. Jacobs. On November 20th, the Board voted not to count his provisional ballot and to send correspondence to the voter to gather additional information.
- On November 21st, the BOE sent a letter to Mr. Jacobs requesting that he contact us regarding the provisional ballot he had cast. 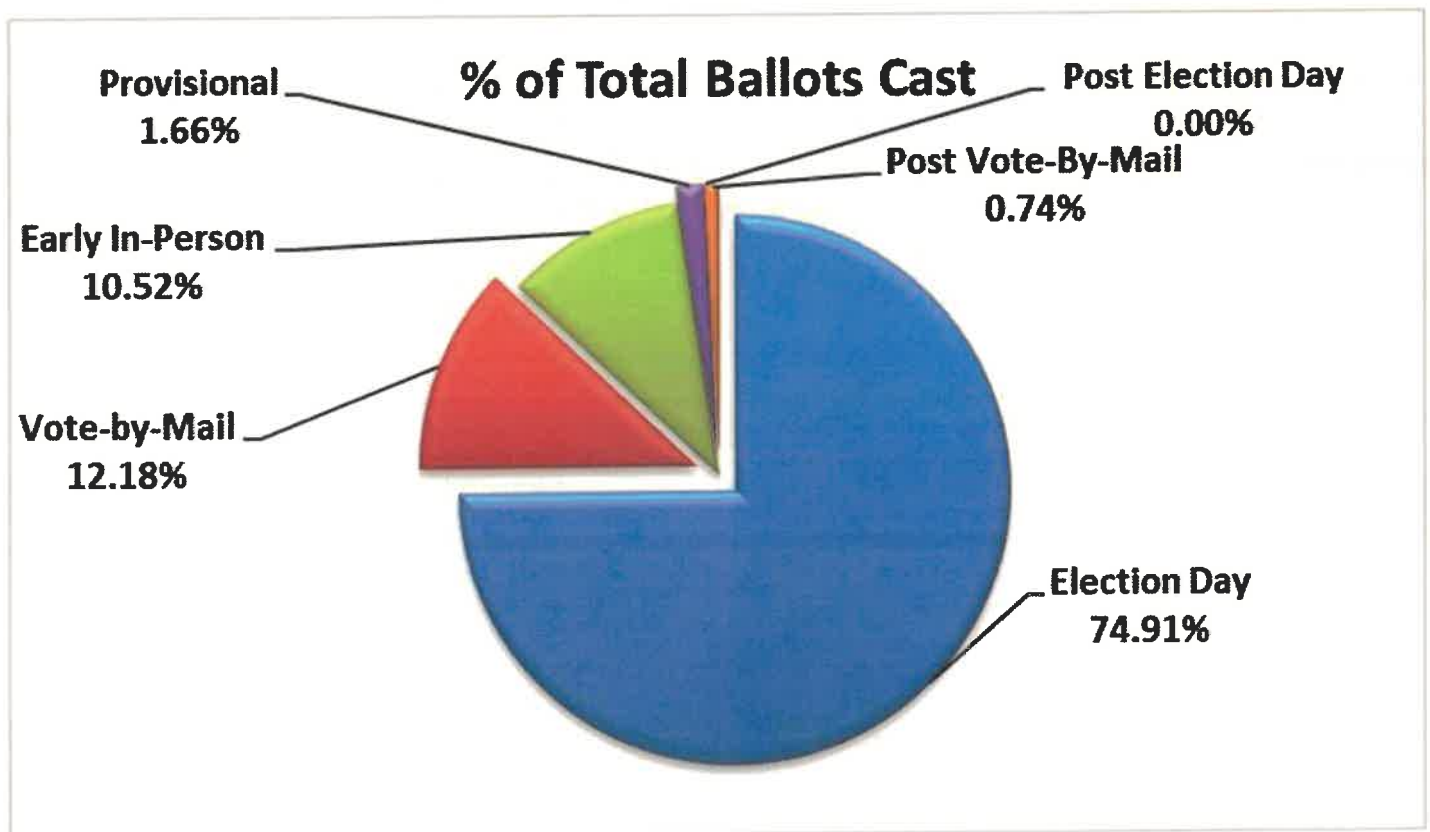

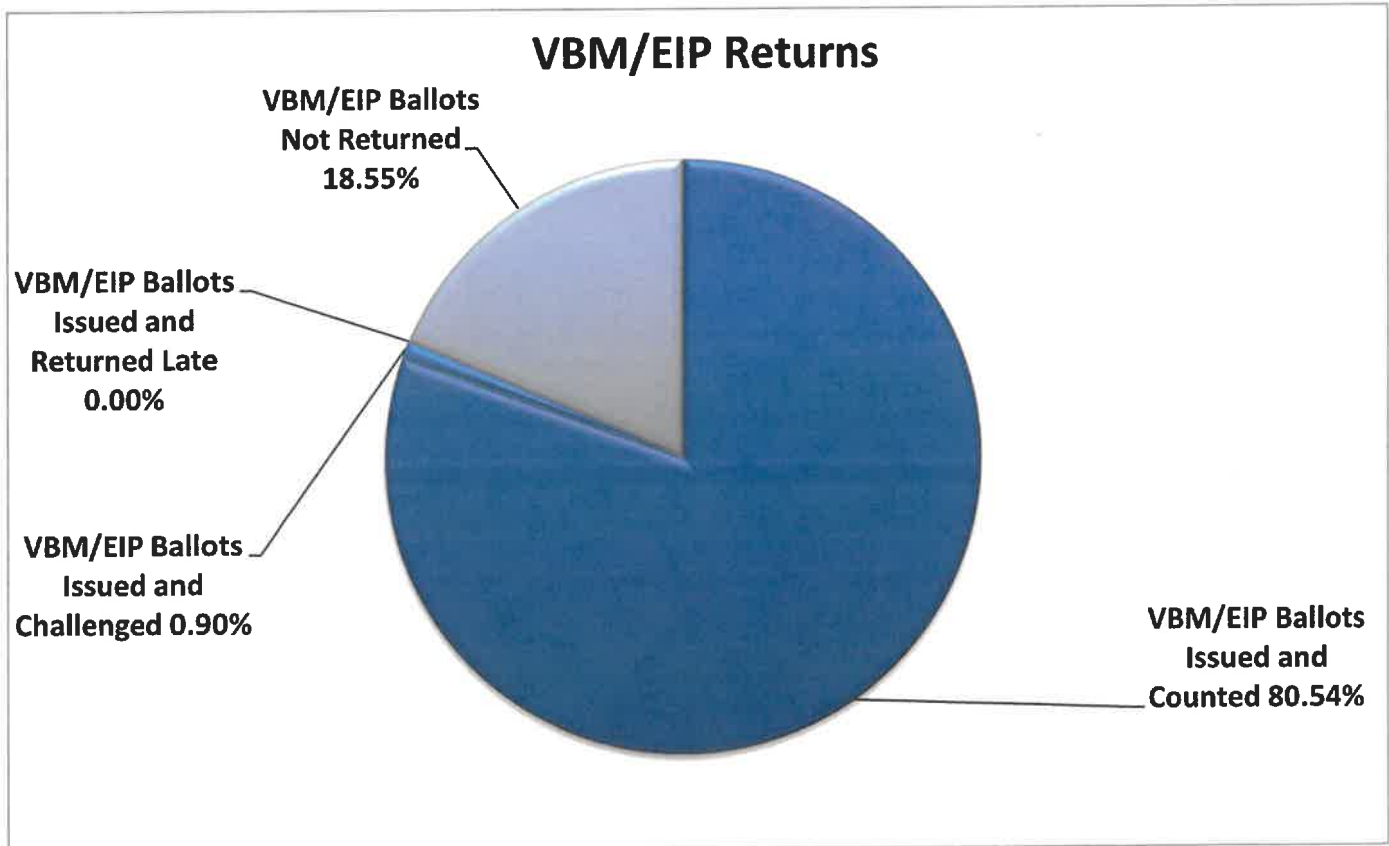

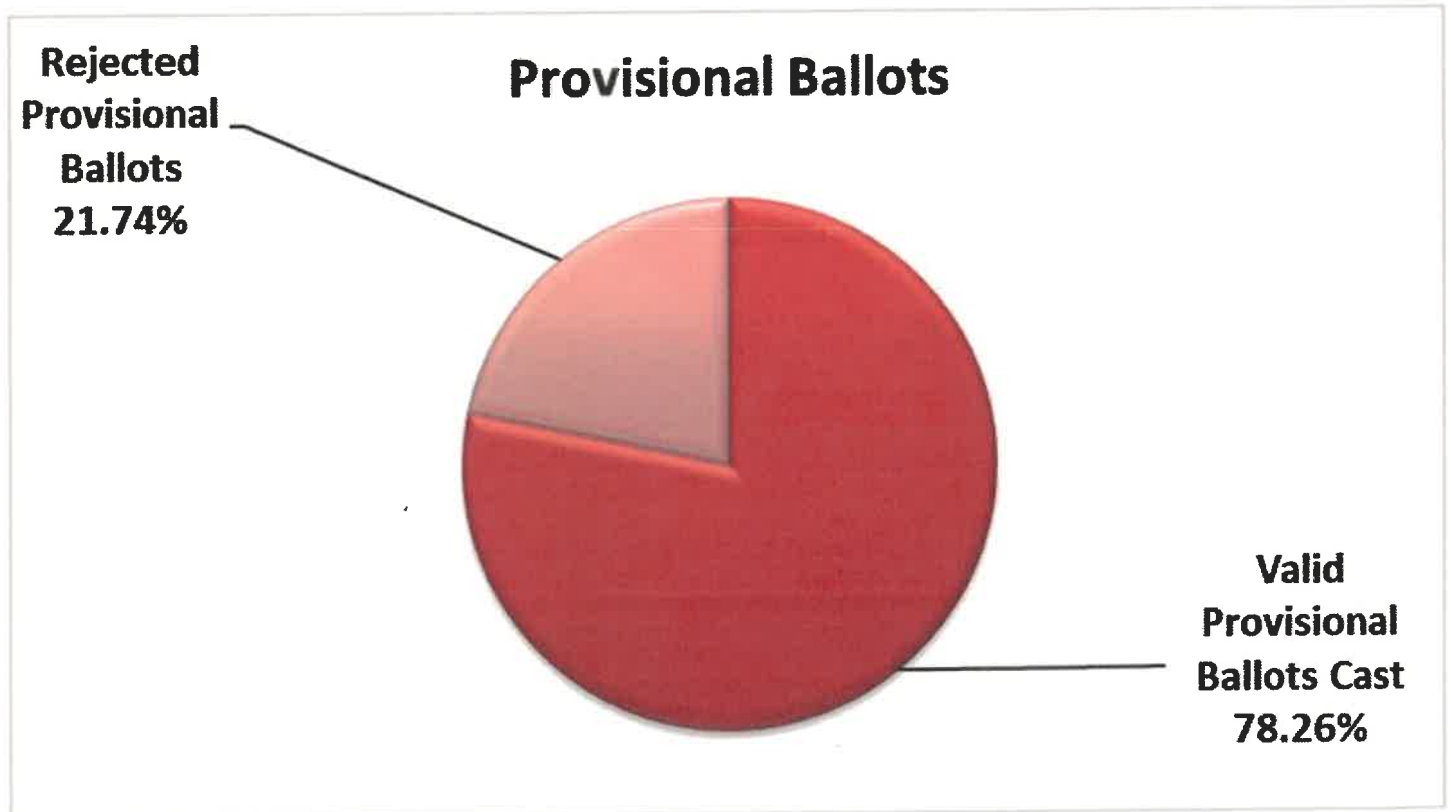


PROVISIONAL VOTING SUMMARY

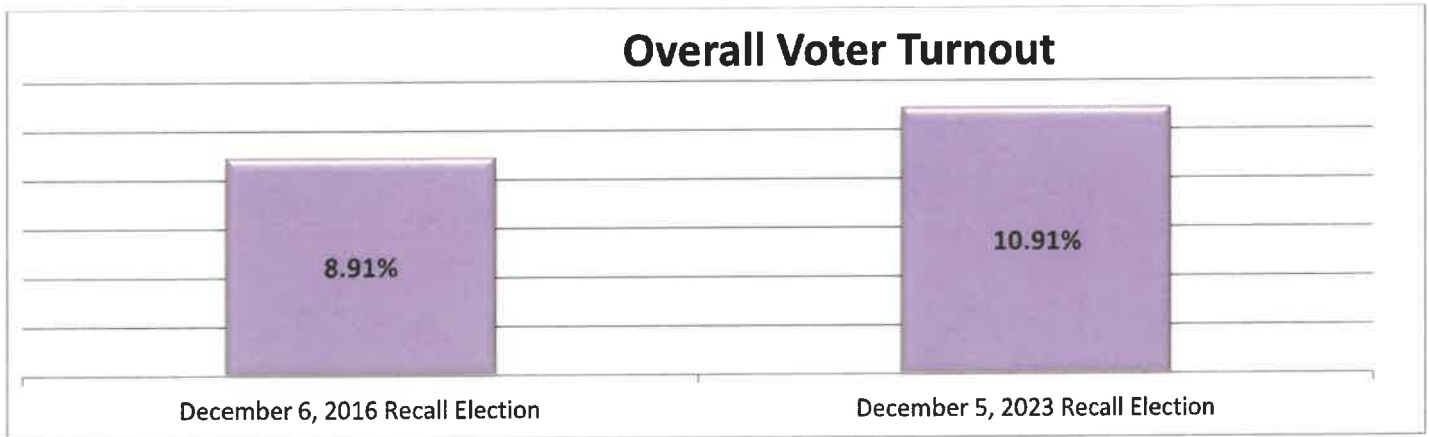

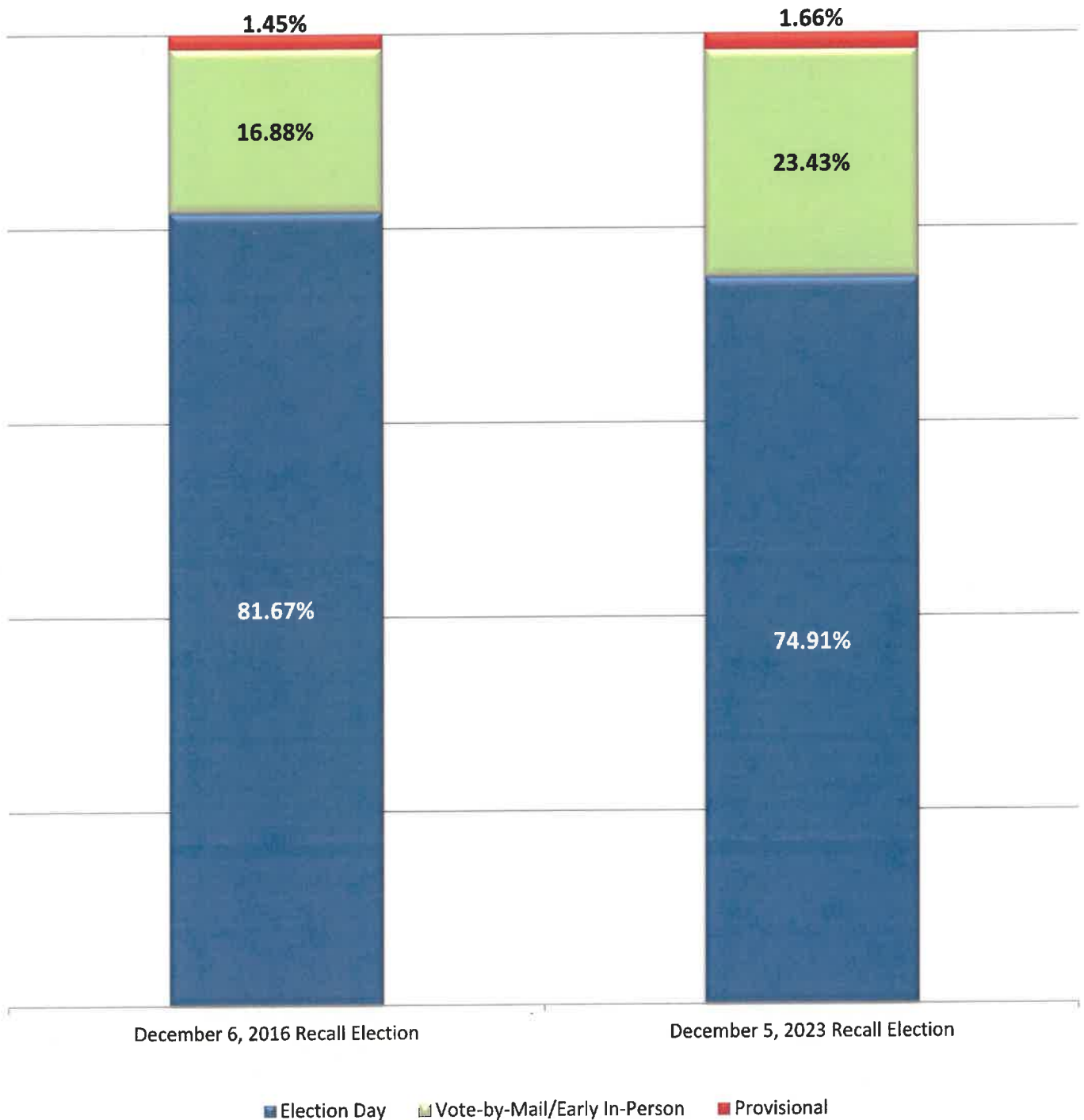

Ballots Cast by Category - % of Total Ballots Cast

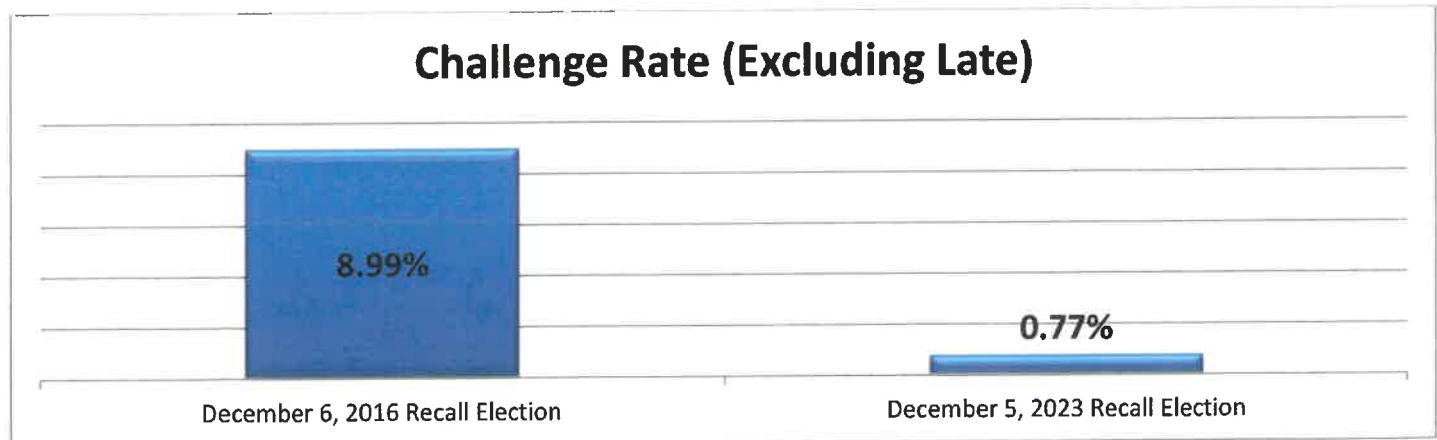
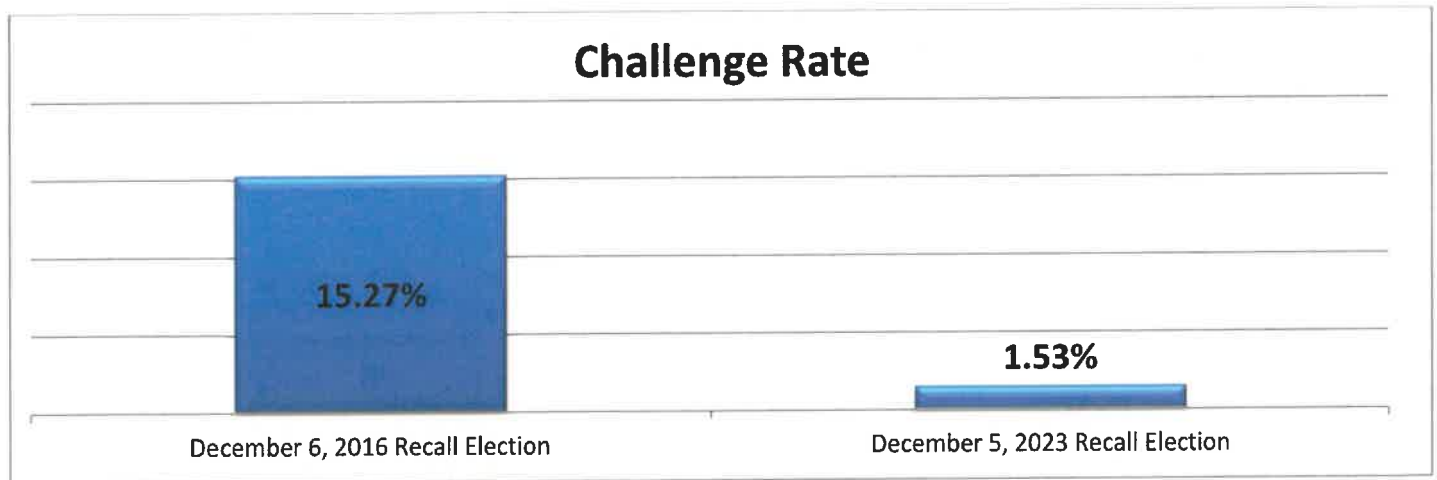

Voter Turnout by Category



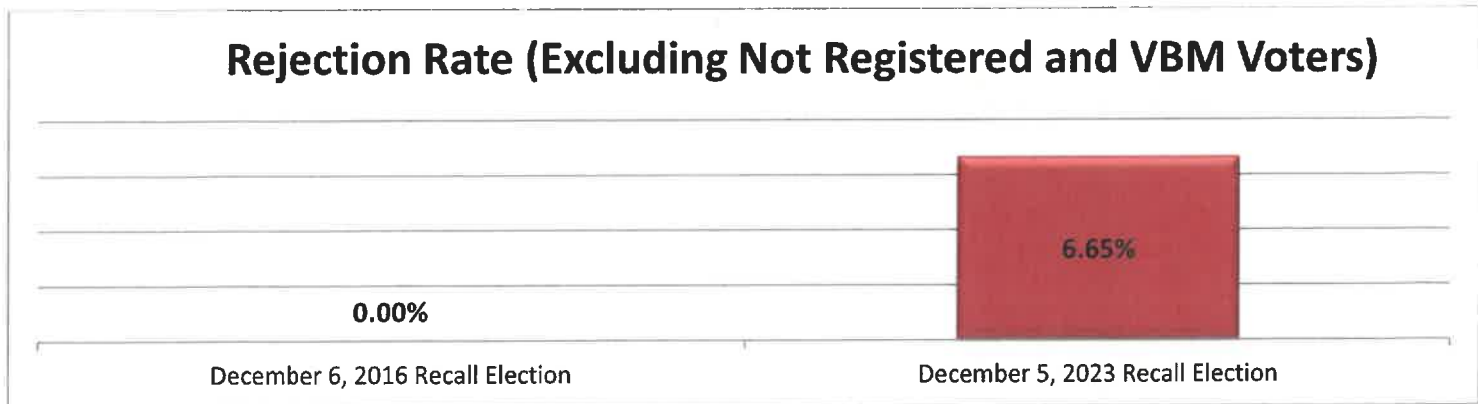
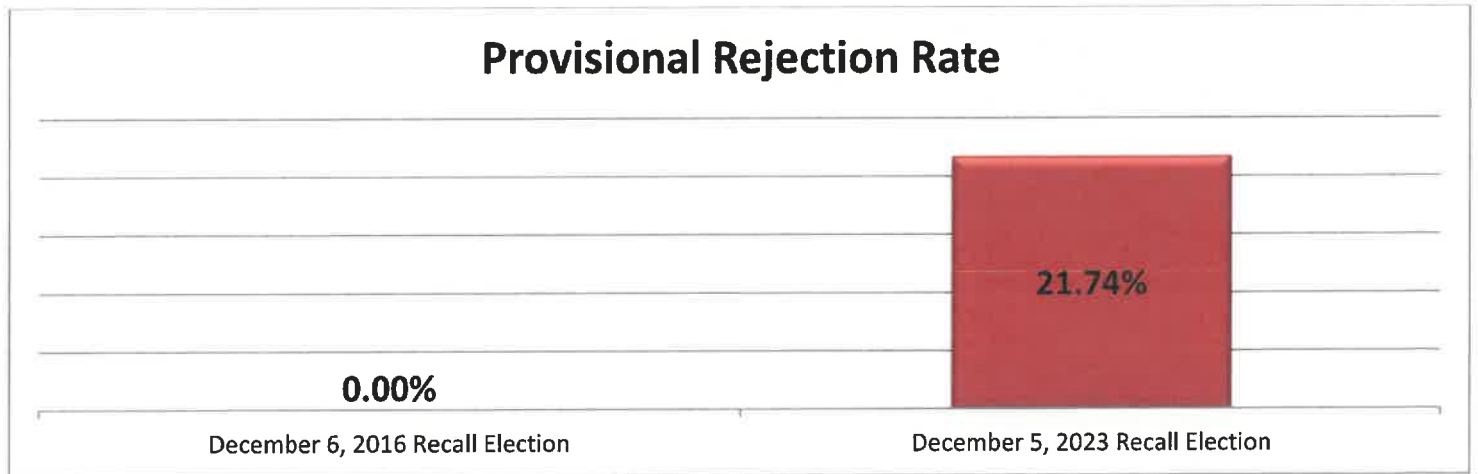

I. Opening and Closing EIP Voting Location

A. Initial setup (First Day of Voting)

On the first day of Early In-Person (EIP) voting (October 11th), four Clear Cast Scanners were turned on and made ready for voting for the election. A zero report was generated to show the machines had no ballots that were scanned and tabulated for the election. At least one full-time staff member was part of a bipartisan team responsible for performing this operation. The team then signed off on the Zero Report and stored it with the respective security logbook. One Clear Cast Scanner was closed but left active to serve as a back-up scanner in the event of malfunction of the primary scanners. Two scanners were positioned in the main voting area, and one was placed by the exit of the ADA area. Meanwhile, another team prepared the Print Now ballot printing on-demand stations for voting by logging into the program, removing stored blank ballot stock from the locked cabinets and loading it into the printers.

During the four weeks of EIP voting we kept three Clear Cast Scanner operational in the room and a fourth scanner was opened but kept in the locked ballot room storage area so that it could be deployed immediately if needed. We added a third scanner to the main voting area during the weekend of voting before the election and set up another scanner as a backup.

B. Daily Opening and Closing of Polling Places

Unlike Clear Cast Scanners used at the polling locations on Election Day, the Clear Cast Scanners used at the EIP voting location are “opened” (turned on) and “closed” (shut down) each day, but technically polling is open until 7:30 p.m. on Election Night. Each day the BOE was open for voting during EIP (October 11-November 5), we reviewed the Clear Cast Scanner Audit Log for the opening and closing times of each Clear Cast Scanner used. Security seals and total votes were checked for discrepancies from closing the night before. There were never any discrepancies.

The scanners were opened and ready for voters fifteen minutes before the opening of voting each day. For closing times, we first ensured that no machine was shut down prior to closing times prescribed by SOS directive.

Expecting a voter turnout equal to, if not greater than the August Special Election, we started with twelve full-time operators and four part-time (10 a.m. to 2 p.m.) operators. We then added three more full-time operators during the last week of voting and the weekend for a total of 19 EIP Election Officials to close out the election cycle. The weekend before the election, we had a few full-time staff members from CPS and Registration present to handle an anticipated increase in voters.

C. Signing the Oath of Office

Before Early In-Person voting began, a designee of the manager of CPS (Stephen Doell, Supervisor) administered the Oath to the Early In-Person Precinct Election Officials (EIP PEOs) orally and they, in turn, signed a written copy of the Oath.

D. Final close of Polls (Election Day 7:30 p.m.)

The final close of polls for the Early In-Person vote center was Sunday, November 5th at 5:00 p.m. All machines were put through the nightly shut down process and emptied of the ballots. The machines were then sent to the Ballot Department on Election Day by a bipartisan team. The machines were completely shut down by Ballot Department staff at 7:30 p.m. election night and the vote tally memory sticks were removed and uploaded by the Ballot Department.

II. Self-Reporting of Problems

The EIP PEOs are temporary employees hired to assist with the implementation of early voting and are directly supervised by full-time staff of the CCBOE at all times. In training, they are instructed to immediately inform the supervisors of any issues that arise. Therefore, after-the-fact reporting of incidents and ballot quantities by the temporary staff during Early In-Person Voting is not necessary.

III. Handling of Provisional Ballot

The EIP voting staff issued a total of 625 Provisional ballots to voters throughout the election cycle. Of that total, 217 provisional ballots were issued on Election Day.

Note: Seventeen EIP provisional voters were rejected because they could not provide valid ID at the time of voting and did not present a valid ID before the close of EIP voting or the close of the cure period.

IV. Reconciliation After Polls are Closed – Delivering Ballots to the Ballot Department

A. Completing Reconciliation Duties

The number of ballots issued cast at the CCBOE Early In-Person voting center was 21,659 including 79 Take-Away ballots. *Note: A Take-Away ballot is like a Vote-by-Mail ballot in that the voter completes an application to receive their ballot. The ballot must be returned in the Identification Envelope and is under the same deadlines as a Vote-by-Mail ballot.*

B. Delivering Ballots to the Ballot Department

Staff emptied the collection bins for each scanner every day and kept the ballots in separate stacks by scanner number. Ballots were then sorted to the precinct level daily starting at the beginning of the second week of voting. After closing the Clear Cast Scanner at the end of the EIP voting period the machine was emptied of ballots one last time and sorted to precinct level. The ballots were delivered to the Ballot Department by Election Support staff along with the Clear Cast Scanners.

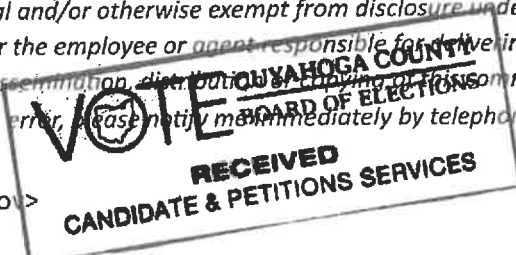

The Voter Information Guide includes the following information:

- Early In-Person voting dates and hours at the Board of Elections;
- The voter's Election Day poll location and voting hours;
- Identification requirements for voting on Election Day;

Early In-Person voting begins on Wednesday, February 21, 2024. **The voter information guide will be mailed approximately one week before early voting begins.**

An unrestricted, informal bid was conducted through the Cuyahoga County's procurement system, INFOR, to 38 registered suppliers. The bid closed on Monday, December 11 at 12:00pm EST. There were 5 bidders.

- 2024 Election Administration Plan (EAP) Update

What is New in the 2024 Election Administration Plan

General

- Changed references of DS200 scanner to “optical ballot scanner” (to make it more evergreen) and AutoMARK to “ADA ballot marking device.”
- Polling locations used for the EAP are the locations for the November 7, 2023 General Election.
- All election dates were changed from November 8, 2022 General Election to March 19, 2024 Primary Election.

I. Precinct Election Official Recruitment, Training, and Accountability

- Training was updated to reflect changes to voting laws starting in 2023, in particular valid forms of ID.
- Updated the curbside voting process to reflect scanning curbside ballots at the polling location.

II. Resource Allocation

- Updated the anticipated dates of board meetings to authorize the allocation of voting equipment, voting booths, etc.
- Updated the anticipated dates of board meetings to authorize the paper ballot allocation.
- Updated the “Draft plan for resource allocation” to reflect the calculations/formulas we will use to determine the ballot order for the March 19, 2024 Primary Election. Removed the table that listed the specific ballot order total for each precinct.

III. Pre-Election Day and Election Day Communication Plan

- Updated the Polling Location Change process to reflect the transition to Smartsheet.
- Added in the media section the CCBOE provides “Election Updates” via Facebook Live periodically in the lead up to Election Day.
- Contact information for Cuyahoga County government employees, as well as Cuyahoga County municipal police and fire departments, was updated.
- Changed the primary means sending notices to polling locations, drop-off locations, and zone stations from postcards to email.

IV. Materials

- The Master List of Supplies was updated to reflect November 7, 2023 General Election supplies.
- References to materials returned inside a Red or Gray ballot bag were updated to reflect changes to where the Curbside and 17-Year-Old Envelopes are packed, as well as the addition of a new Yellow Provisional Bag.
- Replaced screenshots of how to use the AutoMARK with those from the ClearAccess QRG.
- References to carts were updated to reflect the new four-wheel cage carts that were purchased earlier this year.
- Materials packed inside a Zone Kit were updated to reflect November 7, 2023 General Election supplies.

V. Contingency and Continuity Planning

- Provided updated steps on how to replace a ClearCast Go optical ballot scanner (including screenshots from the scanner replacement QRGs).
- The SOS added back in a section about -- “Ensuring proper amount of equipment and personal sanitizing materials and personal protective equipment (PPE)” – that was in the 2020 EAP but was not a part of the 2022 EAP.

VI. Security

- Updates to this section include:
 - Visitors must now sign-in at the back desk and receive a passcode to access any floor beyond the 1st.
 - Adjusted the section on security personnel assigned to the EIP process to reflect current practices.
 - Updated the security detail on Election Day to reflect current practices. This includes specific times and areas where County Protective Services and Off-Duty Police Officers report, and which CCBOE staff is permitted in the Warehouse Second Floor office areas (and Tabulation Center).

VII. Voter Registration

- Updated the estimated number of voter registrations expected in the period leading up to the March 19, 2024 Primary Election using data from the same period in 2020.
- Updated the dates/time/quantity of the proposed schedule to ensure the official list of

registered voters is created by the 14th day before the election. This includes the creation of the VAT Logs, pollbooks, and voter lists.

VIII. Absentee Ballots

- Updated the plan for processing VBM applications to reflect current practices (i.e., using the Opex Rapid Extraction Desks, the Agilis, etc.)
- Updated the details around Early In-Person voting, including the number of processing stations and privacy stations, how many voters can be processed in an hour, etc. Noted the addition of Clear Ballot's Print Now ballot-on-demand printing system.

IX. Polling Locations and Accessibility

- Updated the Approval to Print (ATP) process to reflect current procedures with the ClearVote system, including screenshots of the ATP checklists.
- Updated the L&A process to reflect the current procedures with the ClearVote system, including screenshots of the L&A checklists.
- Added to the Ballot Printers section that we have purchased four (4) BOD printers.
