Remade Ballots

A total of 16 ballots were remade during the tabulation of results in accordance with the CCBOE Ballot Remake Procedure approved by the Board on 1/12/2010 for this election.

They break down into the following categories:

Type 1 (Damaged):	11
Type 3 (Candidate crossed off):	1
Type 5 (Hesitation mark):	3
Type 8 (Majority of Votes made Correctly):	1

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Recounts

There are no automatic recounts in any of the three races in this election.

Over-votes

A total of 4 over-voted races were recorded throughout the election. The exact number of ballots containing over-votes is not known because the UNITY system reports over-votes on a per-contest basis, so a single ballot is likely to contain multiple over-voted races.

Double-voting

There is no instance of double voting in this election.

Poll Book Justification:

Out of 29 precincts in the county, there are currently 26 precincts where the number of signatures in the Alphabetical Poll Book equals the number of ballots cast in UNITY. In 3 precincts there is a difference between the ballots cast and the signatures in the poll books. In North Olmsted 1-F, there is one more ballot cast than signatures. The pink memo indicates that one voter did not sign the poll book. In North Olmsted 3-A, there are 4 more ballots cast than signatures and in Pepper Pike C there are 6 more ballots cast than signatures. The pink memos give no indication of the cause.
